MULL-ING THINGS OVER

May, so far, has been a beautiful month. I am privileged to have a corner office with windows on two sides. It is wonderful in the morning with the sun shining into the room. It is bright and airy – sometimes it even feels fiery. With the blue, cloudless skies and the trees growing greener and greener every day, you feel like you are in the middle of Spring activity. Of course, across Exchange Street, the DEC continues its cleanup and a large number of old trees have disappeared day-by-day. Where there used to be trees there is now blue skies and more sunlight.

The various journeys I have taken up and down the lake, along the Thruway, on the back roads, it is a real wonder of nature as everything is coming alive. Of course, the farmers are out there working hard, and they are helping everything come alive! I saw a field, empty not having been touched since last October's harvest; the next day, I drove by, and it was plowed up and fresh soil could be seen. A week later, I see tractors out there planting (not sure what) and in a few weeks, I am sure I will see something growing – that field coming alive producing whatever food that has been planted. This Fall another harvest will take place and so the cycle continues.

I drove by our cemetery the other day. Everyone was busy cutting the grass and weed whacking around the headstones. They were also filling in potholes in the drive, setting a headstone in the upright position and working hard to be ready for Memorial Day. There are a few flowers on the graves but in two weeks I will see many plants, flowers, and American Flags decorating the graves, reminding us of those who sleep in those graves and those who have proudly served this great country. It is strange in a place of death; I see so much life! Our memories literally make our minds come alive and our prayers for the dead elevate them before God.

I have enjoyed the tulips that have been surrounding St. St. Stephen's Rectory this year. Their color has been vibrant, they stand tall, and the cool nights and warm days seem to preserve them and make them grow taller than ever. While I was sick with COVID, I would look out the window, they were green and growing. Then, I would notice a little color, then I saw the blossom form, and finally the full flower. Somehow, it adds a new quality to our home. It seemed to make the place come alive – even the birds seemed happy to walk among the flowers and even sing occasionally and add another dimension of life. It is a wonder of our world to see life develop and grow. As I started to improve, slowly feeling better, and I walked outside for some fresh air, the world seemed to look healthier, I felt better and better and it seemed the world, nature and I were in sync.

The Church, too, has been part of the life-changing springtime. First, we ended Lent and celebrated Holy Week and Easter. The grand moment of Resurrection when the dead are no longer dead, when darkness no longer covered the earth, when sadness turned to joy, when the stone was rolled away, and new life sprang out of a grave, was upon us. The all too familiar story of Resurrection continues to surprise us and remind us how our souls have been touched. We are baptizing much more frequently now that winter is over, the COVID numbers are down, and families feel safe to gather. I love Baptisms! There is nothing more beautiful than a newborn baby. The smiling faces of parents are priceless. A little brother or sister offering a kiss to their sibling cannot be fully described. The smiles, hugs, kisses, is life itself and we consecrate it with blessed oil, consecrated water, and the light of the Easter Candle.

As I have recently written, First Holy Communion and Confirmation are sure signs of spring and the Easter Season. The freshness of white shirts, white ties, beautiful white dresses and loving parental smiles and kisses all make the First Communion moment holy and pure. "They are like angels," I have heard it said, as the First Communion procession begins. Our Confirmation program is two years long. In that time, Mary Olsen and her assistants meet with our candidates. They pray, study, perform good deeds helping others, and learn about the sacrament of Confirmation. They chose a sponsor, they decided on a Confirmation name, they anxiously await the letter from the Bishop telling them of the date of their Confirmation. By the time we get to the dates of celebrating these sacraments, we have reached a crescendo of activity and prayer. Once again, the Church, life, nature, is bursting forth with the Holy Spirit, a new generation of Christians, and the beauty and freshness of faith-filled people.

Yes, these last couple of weeks have been a great blessing. They have been lively, beautiful, filled with life, painting one sunny Spring Day after another. The Church has continued to witness the power of the Easter Feast, new saints are born, nurtured, and taking their place in the Church. We are called to be grateful. Touched by God, we cannot ask for more. Have a great week!

TOWARD A PRO-LIFE FUTURE IN THE EMPIRE STATE

In the next several weeks, we will reproduce a statement from the Catholic Bishops of New York State regarding their concerns about the rising questions regarding abortion and the Supreme Court. The beginning of the statement follows.

Humanity's salvation history was forever changed when a poor, devout Jewish girl from Galilee affirmatively said yes to life and set in motion the birth, ministry, sacrificial death and resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Mary's fiat ("Thy Will be done.") was a gift of love to humanity, given freely in spite of her inability to know all that would entail, but with more faith in the Lord than fear of the unknown. In this month of Mary, we have an opportunity to reflect on her example, even as Americans grapple with gathering societal unrest over the issue of abortion.

Since the 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decision in *Roe v. Wade* effectively opened the door to abortion on demand throughout the land, an estimate 63 million unborn babies across the country have been killed in the womb before they could even draw their first breath of air. As we await a decision on *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, the recently argued Supreme Court case that could potentially overturn *Roe*, we pray for a positive outcome even as we acknowledge that abortion in New York would continue unfettered, and even be actively promoted as a social good by many elected officials. Sadly, New York, which legalized abortion three years before the *Roe* decision, has long been the abortion capital of the country, a tragic and sobering distinction.

Through the years, advocates for legal abortion have skillfully framed the narrative as one of "choice," and "reproductive freedom," completely ignoring the biological reality of what abortion is: the intentional killing of an innocent child in the womb. Even as sonogram technology and advances in neonatal medicine clearly show us the truth that what is being "terminated" is a human life, the pro-abortion movement refuses to address the science. The abortion industry has been so successful in its messaging that the right to an abortion has become inextricably linked to the notion of women's rights and equality for a significant portion of the country, which is why the prospect of a nation without *Roe* has led to fear and anxiety for many people.

Millions of our fellow Americans – even, it must be said, many of our fellow Catholics – have succumbed to this false notion, and we must respond to it in charity and with sensitivity, but also with clarity. The fears and anxieties of a young woman faced with an unplanned pregnancy are valid. She is likely terrified. She may be overwhelmed with a plethora of legitimate questions: How will she provide for her other children with another baby on the way? Will the father abandon her? Will she be able to continue her education? Where will she and her family live? Who will provide childcare when she goes back to work? For many, abortion seems the only way out.

These feelings are real, and the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy are difficult. This presents a pastoral challenge for bishops, clergy, Church leaders and, indeed, for all faithful Catholics. Often, the Catholic Church is unjustly accused of being more concerned with the baby in the womb than with the mother and child once the infant has been born. As false as this notion is, it is incumbent upon us as shepherds to acknowledge and address that misperception.

Diez Mandamientos de la Misericordia

(Continuación)

¿Cómo te ha ido esta semana en la vivencia de los primeros cinco mandamientos de la misericordia sobre los cuales escribí la semana pasada? Ahora termino con los últimos cinco.

Recuerda que la misericordia no es opuesta a la justicia, sino es su culminación.

La misericordia no socava los mandamientos del Antiguo Testamento y no revoca el significado central de la verdad. La misericordia está donde se supone que termina la justicia. Me hace pensar en algo de hace muchos años. Un hombre intoxicado mató a un hombre de nuestra comunidad con su carro y como resultado fue encarcelado por muchos años. Su esposa no pudo perdonarlo por varios años, pero ella no se sintió bien por esa falta de perdón. Por fin decidió ir a la prisión y hablarle al hombre y perdonarle. El lloró porque no había matado al esposo de la mujer intencionalmente, y él pidió perdón de ella a la vez. Él tenía que cumplir su sentencia, pero recibió la misericordia de la mujer.

Recuerda que solo la práctica de la misericordia hará que llegue el Reino de Dios.

Jesús nos prometió que algún día los mansos heredarán la tierra, los pobres comerán hasta saciarse y todas lagrimas serán enjugadas. Eso sólo puede suceder cuando la misericordia reemplace al autointerés.

Recuerda que la misericordia necesita también ser practicada colectivamente.

No nos basta ser misericordiosos en nuestras propias vidas. La misericordia está marginada en una sociedad que no atiende suficientemente a aquellos que son débiles o están necesitados, de igual manera como podría estar marginada en una iglesia que sea “juzgadora”. Debemos crear una sociedad y también una iglesia que sean misericordiosas.

Recuerda que la misericordia nos llama a hacer obras espirituales y materiales.

Nuestra fe nos desafía a practicar la misericordia de doble manera: corporal y espiritualmente. Ya sabemos que son. Los corporales son: dar de comer al hambriento, dar de beber al sediento, dar posada a los sin techo, vestir al desnudo, visitar a los enfermos, visitar a los presos y enterrar a los muertos. Las obras espirituales de la misericordia son: instruir al ignorante, dar consejo al que duda, confortar al afligido, amonestar al pecador, perdonar las injurias, soportar con paciencia las adversidades y rogar por los vivos y los difuntos. Una persona no puede hacer todo esto, pero tenemos que usar nuestros propios dones al hacer varias de estas obras de la misericordia.

Recuerda que nuestras vidas son un diálogo entre la misericordia de Dios y nuestra debilidad.

Siempre quedamos cortos en algo, no obstante, la verdad de nuestra sinceridad, buena intención y fuerza de voluntad. Sólo la misericordia, recibéndola y dándola, nos puede apartar de las agitadas aguas de nuestra propias ansiedades, inquietud y tristeza. Sólo conociendo la misericordia conocemos la gratitud.
