MULL-ING THINGS OVER

This weekend is Memorial Day Weekend. In many ways it is the first holiday weekend of the summer – even though summer is three weeks off. Very often, this is the first big picnic of the season. It is a time when family travels to a central gathering area where stories will be told, and good food is served. For many, it is the first time after winter that families gather. Those favorite salads will be served, we fondly look forward to those grilled hots and hamburgers, we know a good time will be had by all!

Memorial Day is a time for parades, visits to the cemetery, hoisting the flag and hanging the red-white-and blue! It is, however, also a Day of solemn remembrance. It is a time when we pause for a moment, bow our heads, and remember those who have made the ultimate sacrifice. Memorial Day challenges us every year to recall that freedom and all we enjoy as Americans comes with responsibility. It is a time when we look back on our history and remember the struggles our ancestors endured in the Revolutionary War, in the War of 1812, in a Civil War, in two World Wars, in the Korean War, in the Vietnam War, in the invasions of Iraq and Afghanistan, and now as we stand ready in the War of the Ukraine. Americans have died, we must remember.

Now, there is nothing wrong with Memorial Day celebrations. It is part of our great privilege as Americans to be able to celebrate our pride as Americans, to enjoy the freedoms for which we have sacrificed, to gather our loved ones to celebrate who we are as free Americans. There is nothing wrong with hosting parades, listening to patriotic music, attending social patriotic gatherings, and showing our American pride. These are part of the privilege granted to us as free citizens and work hard every day to remain free and recognize the dignity and life we have as Americans. We must do this to build our nation's spirit and celebrate who we are.

We must be careful, however, not to eclipse the quality and importance of remembrance. Every time our deceased service men and women come home to Delaware, we hear the words spoken: "We will not forget." Every time we celebrate a funeral for one killed in battle, there is a salute and the words: "We will not forget." Every time we conclude a prayer with bowed heads we whisper the words, "We will not forget." As Americans, we obligate ourselves to be living reminders that our sisters and brothers have not died in vain, their lives (and deaths) have served a purpose in helping us as a country to rejoice in freedom and remember those who have helped assure it. Not only are we asked to remember, but we are also told to remember. And so today, amid all the activity of a summer holiday, take a moment, bow your head, say a prayer, and remember. You will be glad you did, and you will assure our American heroes that we have not forgotten.

Have you ever noticed that when you hear our national anthem on a national holiday, there is a deeper meaning, there is a special emotion, and there is personal pride? Or when we stand at attention and hear "Taps" being played, there is an emotion present that normally is not present. Those are the moments that we realize that there is a special purpose to days like this – Memorial Day is meant to touch our hearts and remind us of the love and sacrifice of others. We may not know their names, we do not know their stories, and we may not even recognize what they were all about, but they were Americans like you and me. They were people who went to our schools, played football, basketball or acted in our school plays. They were people who proudly looked to the future knowing they were free to create their lives in any way they chose because of the freedoms of the country in which they lived. They were not different from us, as a matter of fact, they were so similar that they could be the boy/girl next door. And now, they are no longer with us.

On this Memorial Day, stand proud as an American. We do not have a perfect country; we do make mistakes and must be responsible for them; but we are also part of a nation that cares. Who is the first to arrive when disaster hits? Who do other nations turn to for money, support, ingenuity, and guidance when they are in trouble? America has the gift of many resources and does not use them only for American purposes, we necessarily share that others may enjoy life as we do today. In addition to remembering our deceased heroes, say a prayer of thanks to God for the many, many blessings our country has received and pray also that we will never stop our willingness to share these blessings with those who suffer and those less fortunate than us. Stand proud today, salute that flag, fulfill that promise that "we will not forget," and enjoy your day's activity. Much has been given that we might enjoy what we have today. May our deceased heroes rest in peace!

TOWARD A PRO-LIFE FUTURE IN THE EMPIRE STATE

We continue with the statement issued by the Catholic Bishops of New York State regarding the primacy of human life.

As far back as the 1980s, the late John Cardinal O'Connor, a giant of the pro-life movement, made a pledge that we reaffirm today: Any woman, regardless of age, religious belief or affiliation, marital status or immigration status – who is pregnant and in need, can come to the Catholic Church and we will give you the services and support they need to carry their baby to term, regardless of their ability to pay. Furthermore, we will not abandon you and your baby after delivery, but rather, we will see that you have the resources that you and your child both need and deserve. No one will be turned away from life-affirming care. If you have had an abortion that you regret, whether recently or in the distant past, please come to us as well, so that we may offer your services to help you heal.

We ask every Catholic parish, every Catholic Charities program, every Catholic health facility, every Catholic School, every Catholic College and University, and every religious community in our state to proactively engage with us in this pastoral effort. Together through the New York State Catholic Conference, we have gathered a list of many of the available resources at www.nyscatholic.org/HelpForMoms. You can also find a map to all Catholic agencies in the state at www.nyscatholic.org/places.

But our state and local governments must do their part as well. Elected officials constantly fall over themselves in rushing to announce new initiatives to ever expand abortion in order to garner votes. New York has long been one of the few states to require taxpayers to fund abortion through Medicaid. Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers have access to endless state funding streams. Perhaps the most egregious piece of abortion expansion legislation anywhere was the 2019 Reproductive Health Act. Championed by our previous governor, this act legalizes abortion on demand through nine-months of pregnancy, declares abortion to be a fundamental right, allows non-physicians to perform abortions, and even removes criminal penalties for forced or coerced abortions. This year, our current governor codified a provision in the state budget requiring all health insurance plans to cover abortion, with virtually no exemptions for religious employers. Most recently, significant taxpayer funds were redirected to increase abortions in New York State.

Meanwhile, programs to support women who make the choice to keep their babies, to the extent that they exist at all, are starved for funding, and are not well promoted. Yet, many political leaders typically cater more to abortion providers and advocates than to women who might well make a different choice, if only they were aware of and had other options.

We understand full well that no Supreme Court decision will reduce the availability of abortion in New York State. With that reality as a backdrop, state government has nothing to lose and everything to gain by working toward reducing the rate of abortion. There is common ground to be found, even in a state like New York. The recent state budget provision dramatically expanding postpartum Medicaid eligibility is proof of this. But why not work together to do more?

Martirio: ¿Para qué Ser un Mártir?

Hoy en la primera lectura sabemos del martirio de San Esteban, el primer mártir de la Iglesia católica. El trozo que tenemos empieza con “Esteban, lleno del Espíritu Santo, miró al cielo, vio la gloria de Dios y a Jesús que estaba de pie a la derecha de Dios.” Cuando dijo que estaba viendo los cielos abiertos y a Jesús, los líderes judíos no pudieron aguantar a Esteban poniendo a Jesús en tal posición como si fuera Dios. Una visión y una fe lo sostenían durante mientras que ellos estaban apedreándolo hasta matarlo.

Seguramente ustedes han escuchado de otros que han sufrido el martirio aun en nuestros tiempos y de los Estados Unidos. ¿Qué causa a una persona morir por defender sus ideas y creencias religiosas—por su fe? ¿Cómo puede aguantar el sufrimiento y la muerte por algo que no se puede tocar? ¿Por qué los de una religión que predica la importancia de amor no pueden aguantar a los que tienen otras creencias, aunque también son de Dios y predicán el amor?

Necesitamos mirar nuestras prioridades. ¿Qué es la prioridad número 1 en tu vida? Darte completamente a tu trabajo, darte plenamente a tu familia, proveer buena educación para sus hijos, seguir fielmente a Jesucristo, ganar mucho dinero para sentirte exitoso, ¿ayudar a otras personas? ¿Tu fe viene primero?

Esteban tenía mucha fe en Jesucristo y el Espíritu estaba actuando en él, fortaleciéndolo, ayudando a él aun hasta la muerte. Piensa en mártires modernos de América Latina como Oscar Romero, obispo, El Salvador; Stanley Rather sacerdote, EEUU; Rutilio Grande, sacerdote, El Salvador; Menche Ruiz, catequista, El Salvador; María Gómez, maestra catequista, Colombia; Luz Marina Valencia, religiosa, México; María Mejía, campesina, Nicaragua. Por vivir fielmente su fe, por trabajar por la justicia, la justicia que Cristo nos pidió vivir, por enseñar a otros las verdades de la fe, por apoyar a los pobres y los que viven a la periferia de la sociedad, por acompañar a los trabajadores, etc. los mártires perdieron sus vidas. Como Esteban, ellos pudieron hacerlo porque estaban llenos del Espíritu Santo.

Desde el bautismo hemos tenido el Espíritu Santo habitando dentro de nosotros, protegiéndonos, fortaleciéndonos, inspirándonos, ayudándonos y animándonos. ¡Lleno del Espíritu Santo! ¿Te sientes la acción de Dios dentro de ti en tu vida diaria? ¿Pudieras dar tu vida por tu fe? Ellos dieron testimonio de su fe por el hecho de entregar sus vidas libremente. Hace dos años el Papa Francisco honró a 13,000 mártires del siglo 20 en una ceremonia espectacular en el Coliseo. Los que han perdido sus vidas dan a los vivos más fuerza y esperanza. Hay que recordar a los de los primeros siglos iguales como los de nuestros tiempos. Hay persecución en cada siglo. Quien sabe si tiene que dar el testimonio a su fe por el martirio, pero sí Dios pide que demos testimonio público por medio de nuestras acciones diarias. ¿Dios y tu fe son tu prioridad #1?

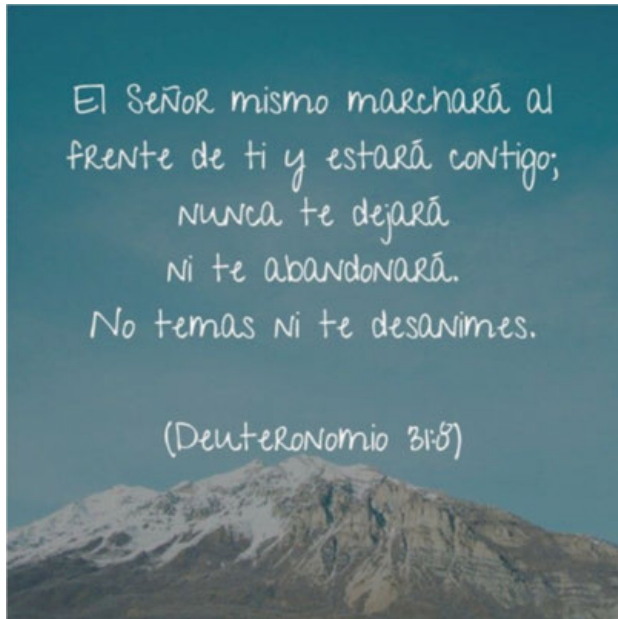
