MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Recently, I was invited to be a part of a Memorial Service for the New York State Troopers. Annually, in May, they have a service to remember all Troopers who have died in service to the People of the State of New York. For me, it is a moving service as we hear the stories of these brave men and women, and I also have an opportunity to meet the families of the deceased Troopers.

It was a beautiful spring day when I arrived at Troop E headquarters for this service. The sun was shining, and the sky was blue. As I waited near the seating section, the families began to arrive. Some I have seen every year and we chatted and got caught up. Others were new this year as I greeted them and answered some questions.

It did not take long, and the Officers and other state officials soon filed out and took their places. The colors were posted, the flags were lowered, Taps was played, and all bowed their heads for the opening prayer. I intoned the words:

"Eternal God, we gather this morning as a people of faith and confidence."

Bless this gathering and bring it peace.

We have entrusted our deceased into your loving hands at the time of their death and we remember them every day.

Hear us at this special moment and draw close to us and remain close to our loved ones.

May their service be gratefully recognized, their memory be lovingly kept,

and may your mercy generously flow around them.

May the words, gestures, and signs of love today

forever touch our hearts and give us confidence and peace.

You are God forever and ever. Amen."

As I walked back to my place, all were seated, and the Commander began to speak of the sacrifices made by these young men and women.

One by one, the family members were introduced, one of them were given a rose and escorted to the memorial monument on which each name is engraved. They placed the rose, the two guards slowly saluted and quietly they returned to their chairs. While this was going on, we heard the stories of their death. One was shot as he reached the doorway for a domestic dispute. One was involved in a traffic stop and shot as the car sped away. One was working undercover and was shot in his car. Several died from exposure on 9/11. They were sad stories but stories that needed to be told and retold so that we would remember. I could see tears in the eyes of the family members. Two of the deceased had only been on the job for under a year. One of them left a six-month pregnant wife behind who would raise this child and, I am sure, tell her husband's story. I thought to myself how sad – brought down so early in life due to the violence and hatred of others. Another had only three months to retirement – he did not live to retire. All the stories would pull at your heart strings. Here the families were continuing to keep vigil and remember.

I began to notice the sounds of traffic as the service continued. The barracks is located on Route #332 in Canandaigua, and traffic is very busy at mid-day. It struck me that the world goes on, activities do not stop, people's lives continue even as we remember our dead. Then, I began to think that it was just for this reason that these folks risked (and lost) their lives. Peace and security are the goal of every trooper. They protect the weak, helpless, and vulnerable. They try to curb violence and give a sense of good order to the society in which we live, and insure that people enjoy their freedoms. Now, these are dead, and the world goes on, perhaps a better place because of their service and their witness.

We have prayed for their families and their friends, We have renewed our confidence in your loyalty and love.

Now, we call out to you for your holy blessing, watch over these men and women who have pledged to serve and protect,

help them in their work and guide them in their service,

when they begin each shift give them confidence and keep them safe.

Bless, too, those who serve our great country – Especially those on foreign shores and in harms' way.

May they know of our thoughts and confident prayers.

One day we ask that you bring them safely home. May we all, as Americans, remember those who have made the ultimate sacrifice

so that, in freedom, we can celebrate life together.

You are God forever and ever. Amen.

As I drove home, I was reminded of what a great country we live in – on the good and the bad days - and how lucky we are that dedicated men and women are here to protect us.

We envision a New York where access to quality prenatal care and healthy birth outcomes are the same whatever your ZIP code, the color of your skin or your country of origin. We envision a New York where employers and educational institutions fully accommodate the needs of pregnant women and new mothers so that they can carry their babies to term without fear of negative financial, professional, or academic consequences. We envision a New York where public policies promote adoption through tax credits and other incentives for both birth mothers and adoptive parents.

Further, we envision a New York where no mothers or children fall through the crack of the social safety net, and quality health care is guaranteed for all. We envision a New York where quality childcare is affordable and accessible for all. We envision a New York where marriage between one man and one woman is promoted as a societal good geared toward stable raising of children. We envision a New York where boys and men are taught to respect women and to accept and embrace the financial, physical, and emotional responsibilities of fatherhood. We envision a New York where post-abortive women who are suffering emotionally are given the services they need to heal, and the acknowledgement that their pain is real. El Espíritu Santo como el Paracleto

Esta semana celebramos la fiesta del Espíritu Santo y el próximo domingo celebramos la Santísima Trinidad. Puede ser cuando alguien te pregunta quién es el Espíritu Santo, la repuesta inmediata es que es la tercera persona de la Trinidad, y es uno con el Padre y el Hijo. Ninguno es más importante ni más poderoso que el otro. Es cierto porque se forman un Dios. En el Nuevo Testamento hay referencia al Espíritu y su presencia por tales símbolos como un viento, una llama o un aliento. El Espíritu de Dios movió a los apóstoles a predicar el día de Pentecostés; da vida; aclama dentro de nuestros corazones; es la fuente de ciertos dones o poderes.

En el discurso largo durante su ultima cena con los apóstoles Jesús varias veces usaba el termino: paracleto en referencia al Espíritu Santo y ese título significaba alguien que estaba llamado a estar al lado de uno, especialmente en una situación legal: un abogado que defendía. Este paracleto va a mostrar que Jesús no pecó, sino el mundo pecó cuando no creó en Él. En la última cena, Jesús envió al Espíritu como el Paracleto que va a mostrar a todos que Jesús no merecía el sufrimiento y muerte. El era inocente de lo que estaban acusándolo. El Espíritu de la verdad no fue aceptado por la gente. Es dificil aceptar la verdad, especialmente cuando la verdad indica que usted ha hecho un mal. Para ayudar a sus discípulos Jesús iba a enviar a sus amigos el Paracleto para consolarlos y ayudarlos en el medio de sus dificultades.

Juan en su evangelio indica que Jesús y el Espíritu son parecidos, por eso el Paracleto no puede llegar hasta que Jesús se va. El Paracleto va a declarar solo lo que Jesús había dicho, por eso al escuchar al Espíritu, uno está escuchando a Jesús. La presencia del Espíritu no es visible como la presencia de Dios por medio de Jesús. El Paracleto no tiene que estar en un lugar a cierta hora como era con el hombre Jesús. El Espíritu habita en todos quienes aman a Jesús e intentan mantener los mandamientos de Jesús. Hoy en día el Espíritu Santo está presente en nosotros como estaba en los que vivían antes en el primer o segundo u octavo siglos. El Paracleto ayudó a los seres humanos descubrir y entender la verdad de lo que Jesús había enseñado. ¡Ah, ese don de entendimiento de la verdad! Cada tiempo y cultura tiene una nueva visión sobre la revelación de Jesucristo. Cada persona tiene el Espíritu actuando dentro de sí, dentro de cada persona, guiándola a la verdad. No debemos insistir que la única manera de hacer cosas correctamente es por actuar según las tradiciones del pasado. No debemos rechazar las ideas nuevas del exterior, porque el Espíritu posiblemente quiere que tengamos una manera distinta de pensar en hacer algo o pensar de algo.

En nuestros tiempos podemos ver la acción del Espíritu Santo actuando por el Papa Francisco o por los obispos en concilio o el pueblo u obispos en reuniones sinodales descubriendo ideas nuevas para responder a las necesidades en la Iglesia o en una región de la Iglesia. ¿Está esperando ver a Cristo al final de los tiempos? Ahora como el Paracleto Jesús ya está presente dentro de cada creyente y actúa como nuestro abogado, nuestro consolador y nuestra guía a toda verdad. Oremos: ven, Espíritu Santo, habita dentro de nosotros y guíanos en nuestras vidas.


