



#### **Deacon's Corner**

Sometimes we just happen to see something that hits us in our gut and we have to tell everyone about it. Then there are times we could care less. During Covid, there were many changes of hearts concerning God. The people that track these things believe that people came back to God and prayed very hard for healing, and eradication of Covid. As we come around the corner on all of this, let us not lose sight of what we saw during the pandemic. Danielle Tumminio Hansen, stated "during the COVID-19 pandemic, researchers found that online searches for the word "prayer" soared to their highest level ever in over 90 countries. And a 2020 Pew Research study showed that 24% of U.S. adults stated their faith had become stronger during the pandemic."

Although my daughter and I have varying opinions of some things, I think we agree that Cardinal Dolan is a very smart man, and does show us how to live as Catholics. So it was with great joy when I saw this article by him, I believe he had hit the nail on the head. Do read it over and if you see me around, let me know what you think.

**Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan**. *Resolutions to a Revival of Faith in the Eucharist* (CNY December 30, 2021), "I can't think of a more helpful or fruitful resolution for 2022 than to renew the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist as the anchor, the center of our lives."

1. Return to Sunday Mass. Rates of attendance at Sunday Mass were scary, pre-Covid (24% in Archdiocese of New York) and now it's even more frightening. Sunday Mass is a constant, an essential of Catholic Life.

2. Remember the Eucharistic fast. All we have to do now is cut out food and drink for an hour prior to receiving Our Lord at Mass.

3. Genuflect to the tabernacle as we enter the pew...to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.

4. Make a good confession if we are aware of serious mortal sin before we receive Holy Communion.

5. Mean it when you say "Amen!" before you receive the Sacred Host. The word means "I agree!" We whisper this when the priest or deacon presents us Holy Communion with the words, "The Body of Christ." With our sincere "Amen!" we profess our faith that indeed it is.

6. Dress modestly. I'm afraid "Sunday Best" has gone into the Vocabulary museum...the way we dress does show our reverence. And boys, no baseball hats or hats of any kind in church!

7. Participate at Mass! Pray hard those beautiful prayers; sing; listen to God's Word and the sermon; arrive on time and do not duck out early; think about volunteering as a lector, usher, choir member, or server.

8. Invite – encourage but don't pester others to go back to Mass.

9. Visit Jesus, really and truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament, often. Many of our parishes have Eucharistic Adoration; many keep the church open so folks can stop in and visit their friend, Jesus.

10. Let's recover a sense of silence and awe while in church.
