Some of you know that the week after Easter, a parish staff member was followed on the road by and then approached in our school parking lot (while still in her car) by carjackers. Thankfully, there were people in the parking lot who were watching this unfold and started to approach her car, scaring off the carjackers. This could have had a very tragic ending and I am grateful to Almighty God that it did not. We have a video surveillance system in the school and we have been cooperating with the authorities about this matter.

This does raise the issue of on-going safety and security here at St. Lawrence Church and School. This is a large campus with two isolated parking lots (behind the Church and behind the school). All day, into the evening and over night, there are a lot of cars that drive in and out of the parking lot. Sometimes, these cars park in our parking lot(s). People are taking a phone call, getting directions, etc. Unfortunately, some others are not pulling in for innocent purposes. There is no good reason why a car or cars should be in the parking lot near the school playground or behind the Church at 1 a.m.

Added to this is the foot traffic. There are a good number of people who walk through our parking lot as they walk their dogs, take their exercise, or as a short cut going from point A to point B. These folks don't concern me. There are others who are walking through the lot in

the early hours of the morning (1, 2, or 3 a.m.). I want to take a moment in my bulletin article Gangs of teens and/or young adults have been to address the issue of safety and security at our found drinking on our parish steps in the back of the Church, etc. This is not good.

> We will be installing a video surveillance system on all of the buildings of the campus. There is already a security system in the rectory and the school. We will move in the direction of installing systems in Deacon Hall and the Church. The School Principal, the Finance Director, and I are having ongoing discussions about security and will update you as things move along.

> I ask you to be vigilant. When leaving the Church, the school, Deacon Hall, or the Rectory—go immediately to your car. If you see something or someone that you find suspicious, call 911. As we begin the process of reopening, I ask parish groups to consider having their meetings during the daytime (even on Saturdays or Sundays) instead of evenings. If here at night, park in the front parking lot and as close as possible to lights. Walk with each other to your cars. If you see something, say something. Look out for each other. Practice good common sense. Do not think that just because this is a Church, things don't go on here. They do. Please be careful. Do not park in emergency lanes or driveways. Thank you and I will keep you updated as time goes on.
