Thoughts as I Prepare to Depart

On June 29th I will officially leave St. Luke the Evangelist to become the Parochial Administrator of St. Mary's of the Lake in Watkins Glen and St. Benedict's in Odessa. While I have only been at St. Luke's for two years, it has been a time like no other.

Of course, I am referring to the Coronavirus. I had never imagined that public Masses would ever stop, let alone for three months. Even when it did start, who would have imagined how long it would last. I'm writing this on June 10th when we are still wearing facemasks and social distancing in church. Be patient, the numbers continue to improve. The end is near!

When I came, one of the things I began was adult faith presentations. I love helping others grow in understanding and faith. I can't imagine not offering presentations as I love doing them. The Coronavirus almost stopped the presentations for a while. However, God presented a "way". The diocese purchased Zoom accounts for all the parishes. I set about learning how to host a webinar. Thus, the presentations continued online. Including in-person presentations before COVID and webinars since, I have done 17 here. I hope they have made a difference for people.

I also have my own blog (<http://blog.renewaloffaith.org/blog>) where I would post my Sunday homilies and occasionally other articles. During the Coronavirus I had much more time to write. I continue to write a couple of articles a week on various Catholic topics. Anyone can read the articles at <http://blog.renewaloffaith.org/blog>. If you want, you can sign up to receive the articles I write in the future by going to the blog and entering your email in the box on the left side and clicking "subscribe". Then you will receive an email asking you to confirm your "subscription".

Among the recent articles I have written are a few on the topic of change. These, of course, flow from the fact that I am about to change assignments. I face change in both leaving St. Luke's and arriving at St. Mary's of the Lakes and St. Benedict's. There are 25 other priests in our diocese also changing assignments.

You too face a change. You face change in my leaving. Each person will feel this differently. One thing you all have in common is you are losing a priest you know. You are getting a new priest, Fr. Sylvester that you do not know. Change is real. Let us pray for one another, for all priests changing assignments, and all the parishes effected by the changes.

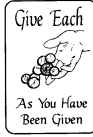

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Do we trust that God will take care of us and has things under control? When life gets difficult, shaky or painful, we may find ourselves wondering what we may have done to deserve this fate. Often, we go to great lengths to explain suffering away, as if it has no purpose and ought not to exist. In an attempt to get God on our side in our battle against suffering, our prayer can mirror a question asked by the disciples: do you not care that we are perishing? As we are asking that question of God, God is asking of us: do you not yet have faith? It is for certain that God does not intentionally inflict pain upon us. God has no sinister plot to test our faith or trip us up. Rather, the unconditional, restorative and rejuvenating power of God's love can bring light out of the greatest darkness and gives hope in the midst of deep despair. We have to be patient and ride out the storm. It is our task to deepen our faith that God will calm the wind and draw meaning out of that which seems senseless.

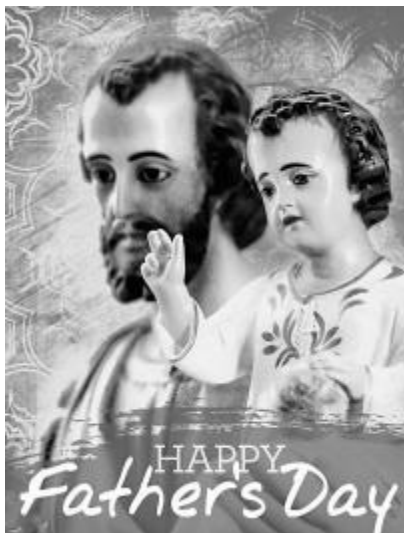

Question: What do the colors of the priest's and deacon's vestments mean?

Answer:

In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the colors of the vestments evolved over the course of several centuries and there was wide variation both in the colors used, and in the feasts and seasons associated with particular colors. It was Pope Innocent III (d. 1216) who gave us the basic outline that was later prescribed by Pope Saint Pius V in 1570. The various colors remind us of the dominant themes of a particular season or celebration.

- White: Used for the seasons of Christmas and Easter and in celebrations of the Lord, of Mary, the angels, and saints who were not martyrs. This color is also used in Masses for the dead, at baptisms, weddings and other festive celebrations.

- Red: As the color of both blood and fire, red is used on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, as well as Pentecost and special celebrations of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, red is used on the feasts and memorials of the Apostles and those saints who died as martyrs.

- Violet: The color for Advent and Lent. Violet may also be used in Masses for the dead and on All Souls Day (November 2).

- Green: A color of life and hope, green is used throughout Ordinary Time.

Other colors: Rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, black may be used in Masses of the dead and on All Souls Day, gold or silver may be used on solemn occasions in place of white, red, or green.
