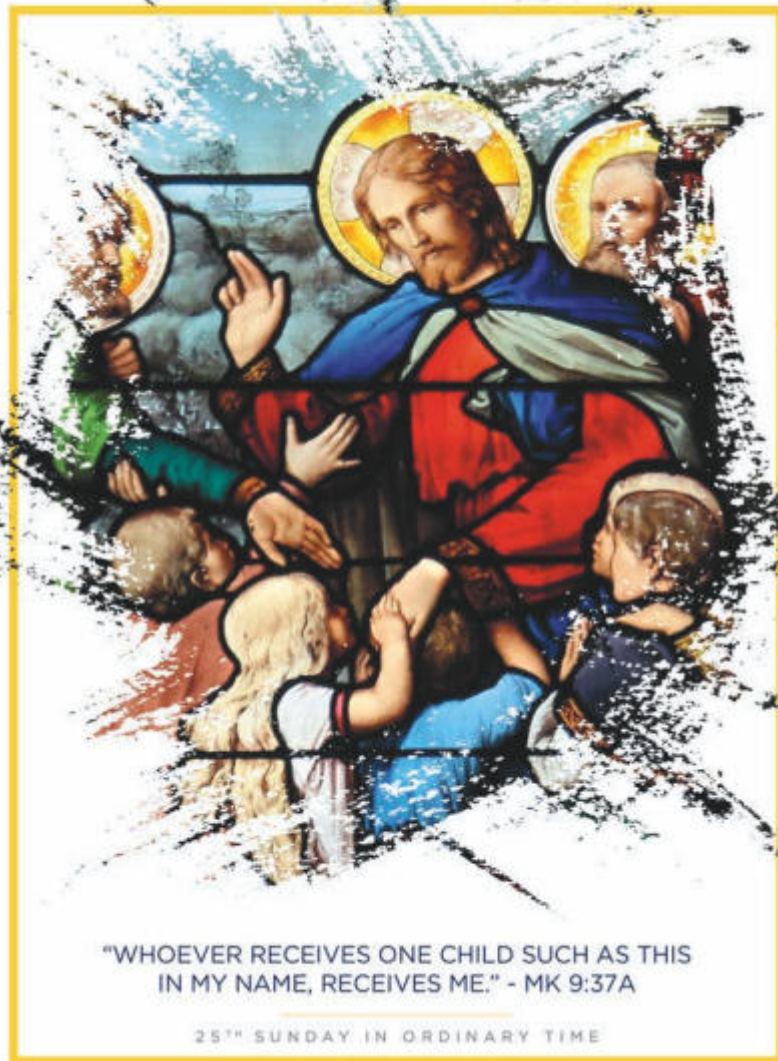

If you're anything like me, you are asking where the summer went – it can't possibly be time for school and faith formation classes to begin again. This Sunday we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. Remember to pray for our catechists today. I think this day is an important day to celebrate because I, too am a catechist, a teacher of the faith. I also appreciate the chance to celebrate all the people who communicated their faith to me through the years: my parents, teachers, pastors, mentors, and friends. I'm grateful too for the example of the saints, the writers of spiritual books, and all the folks I've never met who taught me by their heroic living and deep reflection.

Jesus is a catechist. He teaches his disciples in lecture-like instruction and by his example of prayers, compassionate healings, and willingness to forgive any sinner and restore them to grace. One of the most interesting ways Jesus teaches is by asking significant questions. He doesn't answer them but leaves them open for our ongoing reflection. *Who has been significant in the formation of your faith? How would you answer Jesus' question of last week: "Who do you say that I am?"*

Faith formation classes for children in grades K – 8 of St. Luke's begin next Sunday, September 26. (Facemasks will be required, social distancing observed, and all CDC and Diocese guidelines will be followed.) Family registration packets with schedules, class options, and information were mailed. If you did not receive information, additional packets are available by calling the parish office at 243-1100. Please help our volunteer catechists prepare for that first week by returning your registrations as soon as possible.

Please know that faith formation classes only enrich the formation which begins at home. While kids can learn about Catholicism, the Bible, or prayer in faith formation classes, for most children, true faith development begins in the home. I have a pop quiz for you. Who does Vatican II say has the responsibility for educating children in the faith? That's right: "The role of parents in education is of such importance that it is almost impossible to provide an adequate substitute" (Declaration on Christian Education #3). *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* says, "Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children."

And if you're more likely to be doing yard work or sleeping in on Sunday morning than attending Mass, and if dinner in your house begins without grace, don't worry – you're not alone. Nor are you alone in your desire for a richer life of faith for your family. But rest assured – it's never too late to start. Children are an opportunity to venture into your own faith as an adult. Commit to a few basics: Go to Mass each Sunday (Get yourself to mass and see what God has to say to you); Pray with your kids before dinner and bed (Use traditional prayers or pray in your own words); Hang up a cross (this sends a message about the family's priorities); Take advantage of the moments in your everyday life that are "naturally catechetical" (spend time with grandparents and other family members sharing stories and faith); Make an effort to participate in a faith formation program.

I look forward to the start of this year's faith formation program and seeing the energy, excitement and joy of the children who attend. I invite parents to get involved, join a class now and then, and share their faith with the children. My hope is that with the commitment of parents, catechists, and the grace of God, our children will have a good foundation upon which their faith will grow for the rest of their lives.

**LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**

What does it mean to be God's servant? In essence, it means being willing to call the world back to its childlike innocence, showing all that a joy-filled playfulness has a place in life. The servant of God serves to foster the Kingdom of God. God's kingdom is not a sterile, unhappy, strict, and rigid reality. It is quite the opposite. It is a kingdom devoid of jealousy and selfish ambition where peace, gentleness, mercy, and good works abound. To be a servant of this kingdom means that selfish ambition must be set aside so that others can be first, and justice pursued at all cost. The prayer of this kind of servant is not focused on self-advancement or need. Rather, the servant's prayer seeks to detach from self-concern in order to be used by God. In this way, we who are servants can be inspired, guided, empowered, and led by God. We can then be used to lay the cornerstones of the kingdom: faith, hope, and love. It is upon these that God's firm dwelling is built. Accepting this call may place us last in the world's eyes but first in God's

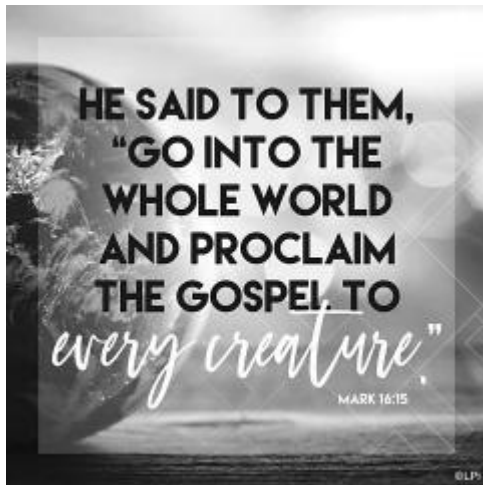

### Question:

Why are Catholics required to fast before Communion?

### Answer:

How we prepare for an important event helps us with the intentionality of our actions and raises our awareness. We prepare our house for guests. We wash our car before an important trip. We create a nursery for a newborn child. All of these actions heighten our senses for what is about to come.

The fast required by canon law before holy Communion has its roots in Jewish spiritual practices. We fast for cleansing and to demonstrate our reliance on God. Catholics used to fast for much longer periods of time, but it was Pope Paul VI in 1964 who set the time at one hour in an attempt to encourage people to receive the holy Eucharist more frequently. That one-hour observance allows us to pause and reflect on what we will participate in in the very near future. We deny our bodies so that we can focus more clearly on the Body of Christ that we will consume. ©LPI

## St. Luke's Wishing Trees

As we head into September and the leaves on the trees outside turn beautiful colors, there will be colorful trees inside each of our churches as well. It is again the "Wishing Tree" season. The wishing trees are adorned with "leaves" which list items that are needed or desired for each church.



Some of the items are consumables or necessities like candles and cleaning supplies while others are bigger, like altar cloths or candle stands. But everything listed is something used to make our churches comfortable, inviting, beautiful places of worship.

The way they work: there's a label on each "leaf" envelope which lists the item and the cost associated. Some items can be purchased at any store and returned to the church. Other items must be ordered through the parish office. For those items, you can put the dollar amount in the envelope and return it in the collection basket or to the office. There is a variety of items listed and the donation or purchase of any of them will be helpful to our parish.

It has been two years since these trees were displayed in 2019 when we were blessed in that our trees "lost" nearly all their leaves and we were gifted with almost every wish expressed!

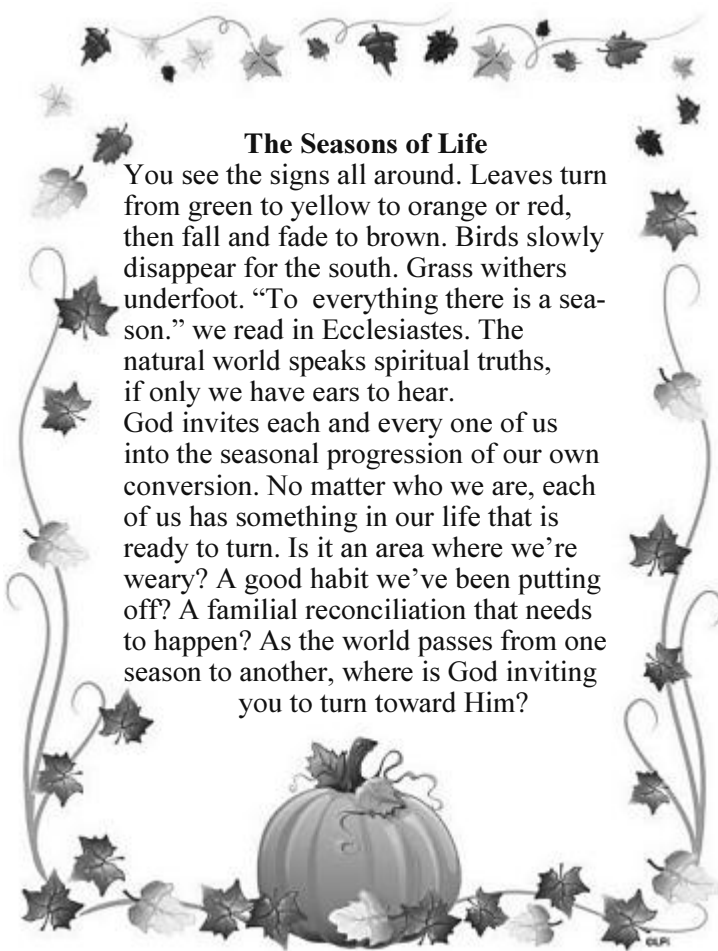
