Ash Wednesday is only days away so hopefully, you have already looked at the Lenten Activities offered and written down in your calendar some of the things you will take part in. Beginning this week and on each Friday during Lent, Stations of the Cross will be held at a different church. This devotion, which follows the path of Christ from his meeting with Pontius Pilate to being laid in the tomb, has evolved over time. Tradition holds that our Blessed Mother daily visited the scenes of her son's passion and what better example is there to follow than Mary?

After Constantine legalized Christianity in the year 312, the pathway was marked with the important 'stations.' St Jerome attested to the many pilgrims who visited the holy places and followed the Way of the Cross, which was officially entitled "Via Dolorosa" (Sorrowful Way) in the 16th century. The devotion continued to grow in popularity. In the fifth century, an interest developed in the Church to "reproduce" the holy places in other areas so that those who could not travel to the Holy Land could still do so in a devotional, spiritual way in their hearts. In 1686, Pope Innocent XI, realizing that few people could travel to the Holy Land, granted the right to erect stations in all of the churches in the Low Countries. Only five years later, Pope Clement XII permitted stations to be created in all churches and in 1742, Pope Benedict XIV encouraged all priests to enrich their churches with the Way of the Cross, which must include 14 crosses and are accompanied by pictures or images of each station: Pilate condemns Christ to death, Jesus carries the cross; the first fall; Jesus meets his Blessed Mother; Simon of Cyrene helps to carry the cross; Veronica wipes the face of Jesus; the second fall; Jesus speaks to the women of Jerusalem; the third fall, Jesus is stripped of his garments; Jesus is nailed to the cross; Jesus dies on the cross; Jesus is taken down from the cross; and Jesus is laid in the tomb.

So, that's the history but why the practice? Why would we pray this way? For me, it takes this thing known as "Jesus' passion and crucifixion", kind of like the title of the book, and opens it into chapters – Jesus' sacrifice for us can't be contained or understood in just those four words; it lasted so much longer, it was so much more painful than we can imagine. It's a different thing to read about than to do. When I walk with him through those stations, by moving from one to another within the church, my senses are engaged and my reflections move from my head to my heart; I enter into that story and Jesus' sacrifice becomes more evident and more real. I can ask myself what part I would I have played; who would I have been and what would I have done then? That question is relative now, too, as our sinful actions today hurt Christ – like nails in his hands or feet. But our compassion and love can help to quench his thirst. The contemplation also reminds me that we are not alone in our own sufferings – that we have a savior that suffered as well – who understands and offers hope. Though the 14th station is Jesus being laid in the tomb, we know that the story doesn't end there. Just three days later the tomb was empty; Jesus rose from the dead and we were all offered new life.

In response to Jesus' great gift to us – this Lent, accompany him on the whole journey.

Stations of the Cross will be Friday, March 4, 7:00 PM at St. Patrick Church.

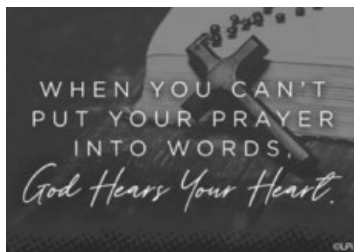


Daily Mass Addition during Lent: Please note that during Lent, there will be daily Mass each Saturday, 9:00 AM, at Holy Angels Church.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

“From the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks.” What we say reveals so much about who we are. It discloses what is really going on within us: our integrity, priorities, depth of conscience, level of compassion and understanding of mercy. People whose speech is judgmental or overly critical usually reveal an interior life that is angry, unsettled, defensive, and shallow. Our speech communicates our sense of right and wrong, the strength of our relationship with God and how we feel about our fellow human beings. We are also quick to point out the faults of others, concentrating on their shortcomings and wrongdoings before our own. Only God fully understands what is going on inside the human heart. Only God can see the depth of a human soul. Perhaps it would do us well to consider what may be happening inside our brothers and sisters and temper our critical speech of what we see occurring outside. Looking within will also help us identify our own sins and weakness so that we can be better positioned to offer the type of wisdom and compassionate guidance that can really be of help to our friends.



Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Ten themes as thought starters. Companions on the Journey: In the Church and Society, we are side by side on the same road. Listening: The first step, requiring an open mind and heart, without prejudices. Speaking out: All are invited to speak with courage and candidly, integrating freedom, truth and charity. Celebration: “Journeying together” in prayer and in communal listening to the Word of God and celebration of the Eucharist. Sharing Responsibility for our Common Mission: Synodality is at the service of the mission of the church, all members called to participate. Dialogue in Church and Society: perseverance that includes silences and sufferings, gathering the experience of persons and peoples. Ecumenism: Dialogue between Christians of different denominations, united by one Baptism, has a special place in the synodal journey. Authority and Participation: a synodal church is a participatory and co-responsible church. Discerning and Deciding: In a synodal style, decisions are made through discernment, based on a consensus that flows from the common obedience to the Spirit. Forming Ourselves in Synodality: The spirituality of journeying together, the educational principle for the formation of the human person, the Christian, families, and communities.
