





"JOHN XXIII...SHEPHERD OF THE MODERN WORLD "

Angelo Giuseppie Roncalli was born on November 25, 1881, in the little village of Sotto II Monte, in northern Italy. His family were peasant farmers, very poor and very religious. This was evident when Angelo was taken to the parish church on the same day he was born and was baptized and placed under the loving care of the Blessed Mother.

From an early age it was evident that Angelo seemed called to serve God in some special way and at the young age of eleven he began his studies for the priesthood at the seminary for the Diocese of Bergamo. He completed his studies in Rome and was ordained to the priesthood in 1904. After ordination he served in a parish for only one year and then was appointed secretary to the Bishop of Bergamo,

Bishop Radini Tedeschi. At the same time, he was appointed as a professor in the seminary at Bergamo. These two positions he held from 1905 to 1914.

In 1925, Monsignor Rancalli was ordained a bishop and appointed to be the Vatican's delegate to Bulgaria. He then was appointed Nuncio to Turkey and Greece and in 1944 he became the Church's Nuncio (ambassador) to France, a position he held until 1953 when Pope Pius XII elevated him to the rank of Cardinal and appointed him as Primate of Venice, Five years later Pius XII died and in the conclave that fall, Cardinal Roncalli was elected pope on October 28, 1958.

Most of us probably never heard of him until he was elected pope, taking the name of John XXIII. It wasn't long until the world became very well acquainted with this new pope. In just a year after being elected pope he stunned the world when he announced that there was going to be another Vatican Council. When John XXIII was elected many people thought he was just going to be an interim pope because he was quite old when he was elected. No one expected the news that broke when he announced that there would be a new council. It was at a prayer service in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls (of Rome) that he made this startling news.

The first session of the Council (Vatican II) was held on October 11, 1962. A lot of preparation was done in the years between the announcement of the council and its first session. The reason was that this council was to be one of renewal of many aspects of the Church. The liturgy was the first matter discussed and decreed. Use of the vernacular at liturgies was only one of the changes. There was a long list of others. Opening the windows of the church as John phrased it opened the way to dialogue and renewed relationships with other religions, including Jewish and Moslem faiths as well.

Pope John's reign would be a brief one, however, for he contracted stomach cancer that proved to be inoperable, and the doctors feared it would shorten his life, which it did for he died on June 3, 1963, only five years after being elected pope.

Pope John XXIII was beatified in the year 2000 and was canonized along with Pope John Paul II in 2014 by Pope Francis. John XXIII's feast day is tomorrow, October 11th, a date that was chosen because it was also the date of the first session of Vatican II. In those short five years as pope, John XXIII deservedly earned the title "Shepherd of the Modern World".
