Pope Francis Encourages "take scriptures to heart"

Pope Francis in an audience of Jan. 27 last year encouraged us to read and know the Bible. He wanted us to not simply focus on rote memorization rather on personal encounter. His words reminded us that scripture is alive, that it speaks to us on an individual basis. Even though biblical stories are thousands of years old, we can recognize ourselves intimately in the characters and scenarios. As we begin 2022, we ask you to please read and study the bible this year. But know what Pope Francis says you are signing up for: "The Word of God infused with the Holy Spirit, when it is received with an open heart, does not leave things as they were before; never."

Please join us. We will be doing a six week zoom and in person Study of the Gospel of Luke. The Lectionary readings this year are from the Gospel of Luke. We will break open the gospel in guide discovery. We are using Kevin Perrotta's book "Luke the Good News of God's Mercy". The format is to build friendship with Christ by being immersed in his life from birth to Resurrection. If you wish to do it individually we will give you the book and you can check in with Deacon George for any questions. Get to know the person Jesus. Learn more about how the gospel of Luke applies to everyday life. Faithful to the church's teaching it appeals to beginners as well as to those familiar with the Bible. <u>Are you registered?</u> Sometimes people attend Mass at the parish for several years but never officially register. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for baptism, Faith Formation, weddings, when asked to be a sponsor for sacraments... and it is a declaration of your desire to be part of the Catholic community.

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at Edward.giblin@dor.org for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquire. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith & a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to a permanent diaconate.

"YOU ARE MY SON, MY BELOVED, IN WHOM I AM WELL PLEASED "

On this Sunday we celebrate another of the Christmas season feasts, the last one, for tomorrow we turn to what is called 'Ordinary Time'. The feast we celebrate today is the Baptism of the Lord Jesus. We know that Jesus did not need to be baptized, yet He went into the waters of the Jordan River and asked the disciple John the Baptist to baptize him.

We don't want to dismiss the importance of the Church's celebration of the baptism of the Lord Jesus. I wonder how often any one of us thinks about the day when we were baptized. Maybe I could ask the question, 'how many of us remember the date when we were baptized? My guess would be about one percent of us do remember the date.

What is most important, of course, is how do we live out all that our baptism calls us to do as followers of Jesus Christ. How deep is our faith rooted in our hearts and how strongly does it have an impact on what we choose in our every day life. That's where faith is lived you know. We aren't supposed to keep it on some shelf and bring it out only on special occasions, maybe when we are faced with some difficult decision we have to make.

I'm going to try, from time to time, to leave you with some words of wisdom, spiritual wisdom, I hope, and today's is a reflection on 'Sharing the Lord's ministry'

"Lord Jesus, touch my eyes so that we may see the signs of your presence

in our lives and in the world.

Touch our ears so that we may hear you word. Touch our tongues so that we may profess our faith. Touch our hands so that we may give and receive. Touch our feet so that we may walk in your paths. Touch our minds so that we may understand your ways. Touch our wills so that they may be in tune with your will. Touch our hearts so that we may bring your love To our brothers and sisters, to the praise and glory of God. Amen."

While this day brings to an end our yearly celebration of the Christmas season, remember that the Lord Jesus remains with us for today, tomorrow and for the rest of our lives.
