As you are aware, we were given the sad news that we had to replace the boiler at St. Patrick's Church this past winter. But we have happy news that 101 parishioners donated over \$25,750 to help with the approximate cost of \$70,000. But now we received sad news that the heating system at the Faith Formation Building, which we have gently kept working for a few years now, has to be replaced. But we have happy news that this happened as the temperature is getting warmer, so we are not left with freezing weather during replacement.

PS: The cost of this heating system is even higher.



Accompany Jesus from city to city - blazing a Trail from the Four Corners
Marian Route: Traveling across Minnesota from the Diocese of Crookston, passing through the Dioceses of Duluth and St. Cloud. The Star of the North Eucharistic Congress features presentations by Bishop Robert Barron, Sr. Jude Andrew, Bishop Andrew Cozzens and Fr. Mike Schmitz. A 12 mile Eucharistic procession along the Paul Bunyan State Trail enters the Diocese of Duluth.

St. Elizabeth Ann seton Route: This eastern branch will kick off in New Haven, Connecticut and will accompany Jesus from the Archdiocese of Hartford through the Diocese of Bridgeport and be traveling through the Archdiocese of New York. The Diocese of Bridgeport will process with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament through over 15 parishes in four days. Bishop Edmund Whalen will celebrate Mass in Port Chester, and Bishop John Bonnici will lead a night of adoration at St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers.

St. Juan Diego Route: Departing at the tip of Texas in Brownsville, the southern arm will travel along the Gulf of Mexico passing through the Diocese of Brownsville into the Diocese of Corpus Christi with several Masses celebrated by Bishop Daniel Flores and Bishop Mario Aviles at the Immaculate Conception Cathedral and conclude with Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of San Juan del Valle.

St. Junipero Serra Route: The western branch of over 2,200 miles begins crossing deserts, mountains and the Great Plains will launch from the archdiocese of San Francisco through the Diocese of Sacramento. Mass will be celebrated by Archbishop Cordileone at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in San Francisco before processing across the Golden Gate Bridge. Bishop Jaime Soto and the Perpetual Pilgrims will lead a Eucharistic procession in a flotilla of boats on the Napa River, Carquinez Strait and Sacramento River from the Vallejo Municipal marina to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, making stops along the way.

As the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage continues, join in prayer that our nation will encounter Our Lord powerfully as He journeys to be near to us. The website has an interactive map that you can follow this historical event location by location, day by day.

Pope Francis is sending Cardinal Tagle as his special representative.
