

Fr. Joe's Week

Tuesday morning I had an appointment at 10am, followed by our Lectionary Group at noon. That evening our Liturgy Group met. We have a lot of decisions to make about our music program. Right new Bill Campbell is willing to play all the Masses, and that's just fine. I would like to have our organ played but finding someone to play is difficult. We are looking. We have put a posting on the Diocese website (www.dor.org), but no joy as yet...Wednesday our cluster planning group met at SEAS. Fr. John Hayes talked to us about his experience clustering a number of parishes. We are gathering information about our two parishes, which we will assemble next month and try to present to our Pastoral Councils in December. We hope to have recommendations to present to both parishes so we can send them on to the Diocese next spring... Thursday I went to the Philharmonic. It was a quirky program and I'm not sure I liked it that much. There were only about 500 people in attendance...Saturday at noon I joined a small group to dedicate a monument to John Joseph "Exile" McBride. He was prominent in Irish-American affairs after the civil war in the U.S. His family erected a stone in in Mt. Olivet Cemetery in his memory...After the 9am Mass we had a coffee/ conversation for those who have joined our parish in the past year or so. It was a nice gathering...I've returned to sleeping in my bed, although not getting much sleep. There's a lot of pain involved every time I move in bed, and enormous pain when I get out of bed in the morning. I see a pain doctor soon. I hope she can give me something to knock me out so I can sleep...I stopped over on Columbus Day afternoon to see how the Youth Group was doing. They certainly were doing. I found them trying to play this card game, but the rules kept changing every minute. Too complicated for me... God bless and have a good week!



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP: Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

What's in it for me?

I think we've all been guilty of looking at a situation and wondering what's in it for us. It doesn't matter if it's a particular work assignment, someone at the parish asking for help with the mission trip bake sale, or your spouse asking if you'll take over the grocery shopping this week. Often, our first reaction to one of these requests is a heavy sigh and the thought: "If I do this, what will I get?"

Sometimes it surprises us to realize that the Apostles were no different. We tend to idolize these contemporaries of Christ as giants who walked with the Savior. But in reality, these individuals were merely human beings struggling to commit to the task of everyday stewardship.

In the Gospels, we see glimpses of them longing for praise and affirmation. We see them jockeying for positions of power within the group of twelve. We see them expect earthly rewards like honor and admiration. We see them acting a lot like us.

But in the end, we see them transformed by the grace of God. Like all the saints, their holiness stems from their commitment to their call. They stumble through, and as they stumble, they keep trusting God. They keep turning to Him. They keep asking for help. They don't give up just because they keep failing at it.

We are defined by what we give when we have no hope of being reimbursed, rewarded, or recognized. The Apostles understood this, eventually, and they gave accordingly. Most of them gave their very lives.

Remember, they're just like us. If they can do it, we can too.
