Environmental Committee


E-waste (electronics waste) is one of the fastest growing solid waste streams in the world. The amount of waste generated is exceeding recycling rates by a factor of five, and the gap is growing. Electronics contain many reusable metals and elements that otherwise would be mined from virgin sources. Improper disposal can also create health and local ecology hazards.



Christmas is sure to bring new electronic devices into your house to replace outdated ones, and result in old, discarded Christmas lights. Monroe County Eco-Park accepts all manner of electronic waste, including Christmas tree lights. Retail stores such as BestBuy, Staples, etc. and local recycling centers also accept electronics through recycling and trade-in programs.


