




Abortion advocates protest on Mother's Day weekend.

Following the Politico report that published a leaked draft opinion indicating that the Supreme Court may be about to overturn Roe v. Wade, a pro-abortion group took to social media encouraging activists to "Stand at or in a local Catholic Church" on May 8, Mother's Day, in protest. In Los Angeles, costumed female

protesters disrupted Mass at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, and in NYC, at Old St. Patrick's Cathedral, pro-abortion demonstrators halted a monthly pro-life procession. Pro-life centers were also targeted, including the headquarters of Wisconsin Family Action in Madison, Wisconsin, which was set ablaze in an



apparent arson attack. We pray that the Lord may convert the hearts of those who see abortion as health care instead of the intentional killing of a fellow human being.




