

ADF attorneys representing a Christian physician and the Christian Medical and Dental Associations are suing the state of California after it enacted a law that requires doctors to participate in physician-assisted suicide against their religious convictions and professional ethics.

California legalized physician-assisted suicide in 2015 with its passage of the controversial End of Life Options Act. Recently the state legislated to force conscientious physicians to participate in the process- ignoring medical ethics consensus that no physician should be forced to participate in physician assisted suicide even where the practice is allowed.






