## IT BOILS DOWN TO PRAYER



**Back in the days of regular employment before retiring**, there were times when I needed something urgently done by our department's Administrative Assistant. Knowing that she was very busy at the moment and that my request could possibly be back-burnered, I quietly asked if I could borrow \$20 from her. This immediately caused her to stop what she was doing and ask me to repeat what I just said, hoping she didn't hear me correctly. When, to her great relief, I told her that I was just kidding she would open up, listen to what I really needed and happily proceed with helping me. I received the "Devious Employee Award" practically every year for my persuasive methods.

**The relevancy of this tidbit** is that people will generally react negatively when asked to depart from their money. Especially Parishioners. After all, money is hard to come by and can go out faster than it came in. Many thoughts go into making this kind of request at Church. Wording is critical. What one person may think you just said could cause major backlash, while another might say "you should have said this...or that". A presenter might go through several thoughtful (and painful) iterations before finally coming up with something that didn't work anyway. That is why no one ever wants to do a Parish Money talk. Those that do, must be bribed or blackmailed into doing so. That said, we do have a couple of people in our Parish who believe that doing such a talk to Parishioners will reduce their time in Purgatory. **Bless their souls!**

**As a member of the Stewardship Committee**, we usually focus our attention on requests for Time and Talent and a little cheer for our many volunteers (**Thank you so much, again!**). Generally, the requests for parting of your Treasure are left to others. However, this year, with Covid we have suspended much of our Ministry and Committee

activities. The need for volunteers is vastly reduced temporarily. But the need for your donations has remained the same, yet participation has also diminished. I understand the reasons. What it all boils down to is Prayer.

**Many in our parish Community** have experienced major decreases in income or much higher bills this past year. A lost job, reduced hours or unexpected costs such as paying for child care, college tuition and major car repairs have taken a toll. These are the people we need to pray for and prayer does help.

**Some, on the other hand, may actually have done better than expected this past year.** Their monthly expenditures may have diminished. The Stock Market has recovered and the fear of "losing it all" has waned. Vacations or trips last Summer and this Fall were cancelled resulting in additional money available right now for some.

**Perhaps it boils down to Prayer** for us to make up the difference in our parish budget vs. our weekly revenue receipts. And our CMA pledges have fallen well short of our needs. We are fortunate that the Diocese will cancel \$5,000 of our goal if we can get 25% parishioner participation, but we have seen much reticence for meeting that goal, too. What we fail to meet with CMA pledges will have to be made up from our regular weekly receipts.

**Therefore, I humbly ask you to pray** that you will reconsider what you have already pledged to the CMA and increase it further if you can. If you haven't made a pledge yet, please do. I ask that you look to further your support to our regular collection, too. I pray that you ask family members and close friends who are members of our Parish and who do not normally attend or participate at Mass, to consider giving just a small amount to the CMA. Every little bit helps. Pray that Jesus will help soften our hearts so that we can fully support our Parish and CMA requirements. And Pray that Covid ends soon.



The power point presentation that Sr. Sheila and Mike Konopka gave as well as the detailed drawing of the office renovations have been uploaded to this page.

The first step in our renovation plan is scheduled to begin the week of April 5<sup>th</sup> with the process of asbestos removal in our Guardian Angels building. Preparations have already begun with the emptying of rooms and removal of things off the walls. Starting right after Easter, we will be moving liturgical items from the Guardian Angels site to St. Joseph's, where we will be having Mass during the asbestos abatement.

At this point, there is no change to the Mass schedule, but it may be considered if the need arises. Robbie Manners, Connie Fitch, and Kathy Steiner have been working with Applied Audio, the Diocese, and Spectrum so that the streaming of Mass can continue from St. Joseph's.

### *Music Ministry Musings*



We have been in a drought of music for a year now, not being able to raise our voices in song and praise to God has been one of the most difficult parts of this pandemic. However, there is light at the end of the tunnel! I have good news to share with you! Beginning with the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, the cantor will once again sing the responsorial psalm and the gospel acclamation at mass. How exciting that we will once again be able to hear the psalms sung, as they are meant to be; and be able to sing praise for the proclamation of the Gospel! While most congregational singing is still discouraged, I feel that hope must spring forth at Easter in the form of song.

I have been in conversation with several choir directors throughout the diocese and the state, and I have observed several collegiate choirs singing with masks on while social distancing and there has not been one recorded case of COVID-19 due to singing. So long as we all wear masks and remain socially distant I feel comfortable singing the Psalm and the Gospel acclamation, which are just brief moments of music.

Also, after several years of singing the Mass setting: Mass of Joy and Peace by Tony Alonso, the music ministry team along with input from parishioners, have decided upon a new mass setting that we will be using for the singing of the parts of the mass. I will introduce this as necessary and I look forward to continuing to broaden the parish's repertoire of music that can be used to worship together.
