We are called during Ordinary Time to walk as a disciple and imitate Jesus in his earthly ministry. The symbols of this season can make us more mindful of that mission. That was abundantly evident this July as children gathered for one week of Vacation Bible Camp and one week of Summer Faith (Formation).

During this time the children (and their family!) gave evidence of their discipleship with Christ in countless ways, but to name a few: they shared numerous bags of brand-new school supplies to be donated through the organizations that our parish social justice team was collecting for; they shared socks, personal supplies, fresh food, and non-perishable foods for the house of Mercy. Additionally, they painted and spread out through the community painted rocks to brighten the finder's day.

Perhaps greatest of all they shared their prayers. Our intention

was to read the children's prayers (found above) aloud at the end of our Summer Faith week, but as they say, time flies when you're having fun! Before Ms. Kim and I knew it, the children were gone, our week was through. We wanted to read the above prayers aloud so that our group could hold these intentions in prayer, since that didn't happen, I share them here.

I know many of the prayers mentioned above are our prayers too – so hold the above intentions in your prayer, will you?

A little note about the prayers above, they were written anonymously, sometimes in a group, in an organized fashion, and sometimes just spontaneously whenever a child had something to add. The children and volunteers, ages 6 – adult, would



write their prayer on a colorful strip of paper, they rolled up like




Our 2021 Flower City

#### The Sanctuary – A Sacred Space

Wikipedia defines a Church Sanctuary as a sacred space around the altar. It is considered holy because of the presence of God in the Eucharist during Mass and in the distribution of Communion.

The Document *Built of Living Stones* calls it a "space where the altar and the ambo stand and 'where the priest, deacon, and other ministers exercise their offices.'" The special character of the Sanctuary conveys the unique quality of the actions that take place by these ministers. The Sanctuary also expresses the organic relationship between these actions and the prayers and actions of the entire Congregation located in the Nave.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal tells us that "the celebration of the Eucharist is the action of Christ and of the Church, namely, of the holy people united and ordered under the Bishop. It therefore pertains to the whole Body of the Church, manifests it, and has its effect upon it." All present – the Priest, Deacon, Musicians, and Assembly -- have a role as we gather as the one Body of Christ, and the Sanctuary must be in harmony with the Nave.

Prior to Vatican II, an altar rail marked the edge of the Sanctuary, separating the Congregation in the Nave from the Priest and others directly involved in the Mass who performed their roles in the Sanctuary. Vatican II, removed that barrier acknowledging that the Congregation, the celebrating assembly, are integral to the celebration of the Eucharist and should not be separated from the action of the other ministers.

Because of the importance of the relationship between the Sanctuary and the Nave, our Liturgical Space Committee and Architect have proposed a design for the Sanctuary platform to extend further into the Nave and that the altar be moved forward, closer to the Congregation.

The Sanctuary must a be spacious enough to accommodate the full celebration of the various rituals of Word and Eucharist with the movements that accompany them, as well as other sacraments to be celebrated there.

The principal ritual furnishings are the Altar, the Ambo, and the chair of the priest. Even though they are individual entities they are all related to the one Eucharistic celebration. The placement of the tabernacle in the Sanctuary as well as a description of the principal furnishings will be discussed in future articles
