



The Solemn Feast of All Saints likely originated in Ireland in the early Middle Ages and was celebrated in the Spring. It later spread to other parts of the Church and was moved to November. On All Saints Day, we celebrate the lives, and in a sense, the triumph of the saints who we know are in heaven. The tradition of All Souls Day began perhaps in the later Middle Ages around the 9th century, where it had long been a custom to set aside a day of prayer for deceased members of monasteries.

Sometimes we hear, even from Christians, that it is unnecessary to pray for the dead because, as they say, Jesus paid the price for our sins when he died on the cross. This is true: if sin is an offense against the love of God, who is infinite, then the repayment for that sin has to be on an infinite level. That is impossible for finite human beings like you and me, therefore, when Jesus, the eternal Son of the Father, came into the world and died for our sins, being an infinite being, he paid the full penalty of our sin.

When we speak about praying for the holy souls, we are not talking about paying the penalty of sin. St. Paul tells us that "the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23), the price of which Jesus paid on the cross. However, those in purgatory are not spiritually dead. They are on the way to heaven. In purgatory the "payment" is for the "consequences" of sin.

For example, if I throw a rock through your window, I have committed a sin. I can become sorry for my sin and go to Confession and be absolved of that sin. Jesus paid the price for my sin (sinful choice); but... the window is STILL broken. The broken window is the "consequence" of my sin, and it still needs to be repaired. The cross does not repair the window, that is my responsibility. Thus, one of the aspects of purgatory is to pay for all the broken windows in our life that we did not get around to paying for (or make reparation for) during our life on earth.

In Rev. 21:27 we read that, "nothing unclean can enter heaven." This is "the holiness without which no one will see the Lord" (Heb. 12:14). So, unless we are perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect (Matt. 5:28), we must "rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us" (Heb. 12:1). While we may die in a state of grace, most of us are probably not perfect.

The teaching that cleanliness/holiness is a prerequisite for entering heaven is depicted in the Parable of the Wedding Feast in which a king invites many to the wedding feast of his son, and though it is a great honor, many refuse to come. Others from the streets were invited therefore, but one showed up improperly dressed. The king saw this man who had no wedding garment, and so, upset, the king had him bound and cast him into the outer darkness. "For many are called, but few are chosen" (Matt. 22:1-14). It was the duty of the king in those times to provide the garment for those who could not afford one, so for the guest not to wear it, is a rejection of the king's goodness.

St. Peter teaches us to clothe ourselves with humility (1 Pet. 5:5), and St. Paul says that we who were baptized into Christ have clothed ourselves with Christ (Gal. 3:27). The baptismal ritual states, "See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity... bring it unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." So let us pray for all those who, though clothed in Christ in baptism, have yet to make full reparation for the consequences of their sins.


