The world around us seems to be a more and more chaotic place. Making our way is much like walking on the deck of a boat as it is tossing to and fro. To maintain one's balance it is necessary to grab onto something firm. Similarly, we have to turn to the things that are most constant and stable in our lives to maintain spiritual equilibrium.

Providentially, several years ago the bishops of the United States had already planned for a National Eucharistic Congress to take place this year. This past week, amidst a chaotic week of an assassination attempt of one presidential candidate and the resignation of a standing president from running for a second term, the Eucharistic revival reminded us of the constancy of the love of Jesus in our midst.

The gathering of 50,000 people with numerous speakers of the Church in the US such as Fr. Mike Schmitz, Sr. Miriam Heidland, Jonathan Roumie and Bishop Robert Barron gave the attendees and those watching online or via EWTN a sense of pride in their Catholic faith and the notion that God is with us despite the tumultuous nature of the world we live in. A few weeks ago, we heard the story of Jesus calming the sea (Mk. 4:35-41). Appropriately, this event is often interpreted as an allegory to our lives. The chaos of the seas represent the chaos of our lives and the times in which the people of God live, no matter when it falls on the timeline of human history.

We are called to remember that the Church must be our guide; our faith must be steadfast, for in it is the hope that is the mainstay of our lives. The Letter to the Hebrews, exhorts us "...to hold fast to the hope that lies before us. This we have as an anchor of the soul, sure and firm..." (Heb. 6:18-19). The celebration of the Eucharist each week is meant also to be an anchor for our lives. We return to it again and again in order to give thanks to God for the gift of our lives, and especially the gift of eternal life won for us by Jesus' suffering, death and

resurrection.

This year we find ourselves in cycle B of the Church's liturgical calendar when we focus on Mark's gospel. Because of its brevity, the Church adds readings from the gospel of John. Soon we will hear the reassuring words, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (Jn. 6:54). These words declare that what we celebrate in the Eucharist is meant to give hope for the life to come. In this way, it is a reminder that this is not the only world for which we live. And yet the Eucharist is what helps us to live even now in some small way the life of heaven. As Jesus said just a moment before: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (v. 55).

If heaven has come to us in the form of Holy Communion, then we should live, to a certain degree, an otherworldly life. In the calm and the peace that should be ours (since we trust Christ to calm all that is stormy around us) we should be able to be a sign to others of the peace he brings.

We have an opportunity to do this now. Leading up to the national congress, there were four Eucharistic processions that crossed the US from the four "corners" to bless our nation. We plan to use the opportunity of this Eucharistic Revival to show our faith and bless our town.

On September 14 (weather permitting), will have a short procession that will be a witness to all of our Catholic faith and to pray for everyone in our town so that by sharing Christ, all may come to know him, love him and serve him in this life so as to be happy with him in the next. This is the meaning of life and the reason for all that we do in our parishes. Let us be faithful witnesses to the calming presence of Jesus in a stormy world.







June 10, 2024 - Meeting Highlights

The Chairperson report was given by Annie Walker.

A welcome was extended to the three new members of the JPP Council representing the Church of the Resurrection.

Nominations and elections of the Executive Committee members of the council took place.

Chair - Patrick Fox, Vice-Chair - John Callard

Secretary - Laura Clark, Communications - Judy Cornwell

Father Mickey offered a prayer to bless and guide the new Executive Committee members in their roles.

John Callard and two other members of the Sub-Committee for Bringing Families Back To Church reviewed their recommendations as follows:

A recommendation was given to Father Mickey that he establish an action committee.

Parishes continue to create a welcoming atmosphere.

Continue to celebrate and acknowledge members milestones of Faith.

Offer religious education programming that provides alternatives in format, enhances teacher recruitment, and provides on-going feedback.

More youth and adult religious programming, Men's Bible studies, parish wide socialization opportunities and community outreach opportunities were all recommended.

Capitalize on evangelization opportunities along with continued feedback on Parish member retention.

A motion was made and approved by the JPP Council for the upcoming established action committee to begin working on several of these identified items of action.

Father Mickey reviewed his Pastors report.

Father reported on the successful Parishes Volunteer Dinner. The dinner was delicious, well attended and greatly appreciated by the volunteers from both Parishes.

The final Church of the Assumption "Give 100" CMA campaign has cut the Assumption Parish CMA deficit by half. Thanks to all who participated.

The Canal Days parking event sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, profited for all Parish Ministries about \$9000. All went well and it was suggested that all Masses for both Parishes be held at The Church of The Resurrection next year, to facilitate this fund raiser.

Father Mickey spoke of general security concerns during our many Parishes services, in light of recent national gun incident occurrences. He and Parish staff are investigating some educational resources for all regarding these security concerns.

The need to focus on "disturbing the plan" of the individual making the threat is very important. Vigilance and welcoming will make all more aware. More specific information will be forthcoming on this matter in the future.

Father Mickey thanked all the current members of the Joint Pastoral Parish Council for a year of goodness and grace and their generosity in service to both sister Parish Communities.
