

From the Desk of ...

Dear Parishioners, Friends, and Visitors,

By the time you read this, Michael Carroll and Paul Heiland will have already knelt before Bishop Lucia at the Cathedral and received the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Paul and Michael were ordained as "Permanent Deacons", meaning there is no intention to become a priest. Every priest and Bishop you know was ordained a "Transitional Deacon" for a period of about 6 months during their journey to the Priesthood. Our newest Deacons have been studying for almost 8 years, first through Formation for Ministry, then through a formal period of study for the Diaconate. During this time when they had regular classes in Syracuse, they have also been meeting with me to gain insights and practical knowledge about the actual duties of a deacon. I am very proud of both these men and am in awe of the hard work and dedication they have to God and Church. Both have been assigned by the Bishop to minister at OLGC at this time. You will begin to see Paul and Michael "being deacons" at masses, baptisms, weddings and funerals, plus whatever else their pastor asks them to do. May their time as Deacons be fruitful and filled with Christ's love.

On another note, we have not had a second collection for our *Girl's School in Uganda* for over a year. Normally we do that for Mother's Day, but just to be different, this year we are asking you to be generous in a second collection on Father's day, June 19. As always, the faces of the girls, happy and thankful are all the reward we need.

Saint of the Week

Like Elizabeth Ann Seton. Rita of Cascia was a wife, mother, widow, and member of a religious community. Her holiness was reflected in each phase of her life. Born at Roccaporena in central Italy, Rita wanted to become a nun but was pressured at a young age into marrying a harsh and cruel man. During her 18-year marriage, she bore and raised two sons. After her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons had died, Rita tried to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Unsuccessful at first because she was a widow, Rita eventually succeeded. Over the years, her austerity, prayerfulness, and charity became legendary. When she developed wounds on her forehead, people quickly associated them with the wounds from Christ's crown of thorns. She meditated frequently on Christ's passion. Her care for the sick nuns was especially loving. She also counseled lay people who came to her monastery. Beatified in 1626, Rita was not canonized until 1900. She has acquired the reputation, together with Saint Jude, as a saint of impossible cases. Many people visit her tomb each vear.


