Good News

Dear Friends,

This week's bulletin article repeats the schedule of events for Holy Week and continues the explanation about what to expect for the Holy Week liturgies this year. Several weeks ago, the Vatican issued directives to Parishes throughout the world which modify some of the liturgical guidelines and rubrics as prescribed in the Roman Missal. Based on this, bishops throughout the world made adaptations based on restrictions in particular regions. I know we are all very happy to have the opportunity to celebrate the Lord's Passion in person. As I said last week, Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday Passion of the Lord, the Easter Vigil and Easter Day Masses will all be live-streamed on our parish website and YouTube channel. All events are open to the public without reservation, EXCEPT for Easter Sunday Masses, which will follow our usual Sunday Morning schedule:

Easter Day Mass of Resurrection: 8:00am and 10:30am

In order to attend Easter Day Masses, you must register! There are two options you can choose:

1. Register online using the following link: <https://bit.ly/3cpFJiG>

Simply select the Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be attending in your party. I encourage you to register with in groups because that will maximize our seating capacity and allow us to keep people together. Several parishioners have chosen to do this for weekend Masses, and it has been very helpful in seating those who come to Mass.

2. Call the Easter Mass Registration Hotline at 481-1113. You can reserve a spot at one of the Easter Masses by calling this phone number. Simply leave your full name, phone number, which Mass you would like to attend, and how many people will be attending. Someone will call you back as soon as possible to confirm.

Good Friday: This year, a special intention for the sick, the dead, for those who feel lost or dismayed will be inserted into the solemn intercessions after the homily. Although the intercessions are prescribed on a yearly basis, the addition of a particular intercession shows the Church's care and awareness for the current world situation as it struggles with the Coronavirus pandemic.

For the Veneration of the Cross, physical touching or kissing the cross is not permitted this year. We will still approach the Cross in procession, but will not be able to make physical contact with the cross. The specific instruction is as follows: **"The faithful approach, moving as if in procession, and showing reverence to the Cross by a simple genuflection or other sign...."**

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night: Please note: last week's bulletin gave the incorrect starting time for the Vigil. The Easter Vigil will start at 8:00pm this year. The Easter Vigil begins with the faithful in their pews. Only the priest, deacon and server(s) gather at the entrance of the church. The faithful are invited to stand and turn toward the entrance of the church where the "Solemn Beginning of the Vigil or Lucernarium" is carried out. Here, the Paschal Candle is lit without the customary fire outside of the Church. The procession occurs in a simple manner. Parishioners will be able to use candles in their pews while cognizant of physical distancing. This year, we will not welcome Catechumens into the Church, meaning those who have not been previously baptized or catechized. We continue to work with many who are discerning becoming Catholic, especially those who have been baptized and have a knowledge of Jesus and the Catholic faith. This makes matters easier, and there are no additional modifications that we will need to follow for the Vigil.

Easter Sunday: The Mass of Sunday of the Resurrection is offered according to the rubrics; the faithful renew their Baptismal Promises instead of the Creed, and the sprinkling of the people with the blessed Easter Water may be carried out in a safe manner.

Monday: Confessions will be available on Monday of Holy Week (March 29) from 5:00pm-7:30pm in the Brennan Chapel.

Tuesday: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be offered on Tuesday, as usual, from 9:00am-9:00pm. That is the evening of the Chrism Mass, where the Holy Oils are blessed by the Bishop for the year ahead. Please pray for my safe travels and return to Corning as well as all priests of our diocese who will gather at this Mass to renew their priestly promises.

As we conclude Lent, enter into the Paschal Triduum and prepare for Easter, I ask that we take time in our prayer to reflect on the 40 day season that will soon be in the rearview mirror. How did I grow in holiness? Did I learn more about commitments and promises? Were the disciplines I chose more about checking a box, or did they help me deepen my relationship with God? While we spend time preparing for certain practices and disciplines in Lent, we should be ready to engage with more fervor the mission that lies ahead: meeting the Lord when He rises from the tomb and accompanying Him and the disciples on the 50-day journey or Resurrection and hope in Eternal life.

So, what Easter promises are you planning to make? Did you find attending daily Mass during Lent beneficial? Then continue to go to Mass during Easter. Did you make more pilgrimages to the Church on Tuesday to spend time in Adoration? Then continue to go! Did you join a prayer group? Then keep going! Did you find the Sacrament of Penance to be helpful? Then continue to engage in it. There is no reason why these spiritual practices should stop, let alone the practices of almsgiving, charity, and service, just to name a few. During the Easter season, my bulletin articles will be devoted to enriching our understanding of the sacramental life of the Church. This is at the heart of our Catholic faith and I believe it will be an eye-opening encounter for all of us.

**WEEKLY INSPIRATION**

We are fine when we hear pious renderings of his messages and preaching but wince when it gets to the part about changing the way we conduct business and becoming more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor and marginalized. We invoke God’s name when we want victory and keep silence when it comes to global solidarity. We talk out of both sides of our mouths too, looking only to what works or suits us at the time and leaving the rest. There exists in each one of us a person who hails our King with hosannas and a person who is all too willing to choose Jesus over Barabbas for the cross. Something to think about this Holy Week!

**Walk Every Step with Christ**

*Holy Week is a week for being mindful. We must set loose the baggage of Lent, and not be deterred by the dazzling sunrise of Easter morning beckoning in the distance.*


*It’s okay for us to be excited for Easter. We’ve waited so long, after all. In my opinion it’s one of the best feelings there is: the yearning we have in our hearts for the Resurrection as we embark on Palm Sunday. And in a purely logical sense, many of us have Easter celebrations for which we are preparing, and practical considerations to contend with. It’s going to be a busy week, one likely full of happy distractions.*

*But my friends, we simply must keep our feet on the ground. Let’s not “skip” Holy Week. Resist the urge to flip to the last page of the book, to fast-forward to the final scene of the movie. Don’t rob yourself of the journey. This week is a blessed opportunity. It is this week that teaches us who we are. In the span of the Triduum, we have the birthday of the priesthood, the institution of the Eucharist, the sacrifice on Calvary and so many other vivid and meaningful scenes.*

*It may sound strange, to advise someone to savor the moments of Holy Week. There are so many violent and heartrending moments, after all. But this is the valley of tears, remember — we are not in Heaven yet. And here, in our fallen, sin-filled world, it is the heartrending moments that seem to matter the most.*

*These are the moments that define us as Catholics. Live them. Cherish them. Be present for each one.*






