



Good News

Praise Jesus!

As the Easter season winds down, so will the article series on the Sacramental Life of the Church. There is one area that has not yet been covered: Sacraments of Service, which are Matrimony and Holy Orders. These vocations are meant to give life to the Church by their focus and purpose. Priests administer the sacraments, preach the gospel and lead the growth and development of the people that are assigned to their care. Marriage is intended to be fruitful and multiply, not only with having children but by raising them in the practice of the faith and thereby perpetuating the belief and witness to faith in Jesus Christ. This week, I will cover Holy Orders, which are comprised of three degrees or steps: deacon, priest, and bishop. With the Order of Deacon, there are two distinctions: transitional and permanent. Before a priest can be ordained to the presbyterate, he must first be ordained a deacon (transitional.) The Code of Canon Law prescribes a suitable amount of time (six months) to properly continue the last stages of formation before receiving the priesthood. All Saints Parish is blessed to have (as of this writing) the only candidate for the permanent diaconate in our Diocese: our own Brian Mizzoni. Brian often assists at the 5:00pm Mass and principally at the 10:30 Mass as server and lector. He is active in the life of the Parish by leading the Tuesday Adoration series and areas of Faith Formation. He is a native of Corning and resides in the Houghton Plot area with his family. Brian began his studies for the diaconate before I arrived in Corning and our paths crossed several times in the years before my assignment here as pastor. Last Friday, Brian graduated from St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry and received a degree in Master of Arts degree in Pastoral Studies. If all continues as planned, Brian will be ordained at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart on Saturday, August 21 at 10:00am. I ask that you continue to pray for Brian and his family as he completes the last few stages of preparation for this day.

I know what many of you are thinking, since many of you have asked: Does that mean Brian will be assigned to All Saints Parish? The answer is: I don't know! When a man is ordained to any degree of Holy Orders, he is ordained for service for a particular diocese or religious order. There is no such thing as receiving Holy Orders without a specific attachment to a bishop/diocese or religious order. When Fr. Martuscello and I were ordained priests, we were ordained for the Diocese of Rochester. This means we are at the service and direction of the diocesan bishop who determines where we serve and in what capacity. In a particular circumstance, a priest can be released to another diocese or a specific ministry, but it is not common. The same is true with a permanent deacon. He is assigned to serve at the direction of the Bishop for the diocese he is ordained. While there is no guarantee that Brian will be assigned here when he is ordained, we can certainly remain hopeful for this and pray that whatever happens, it will be God's will. There is a certain excitement a parish has in preparing to see a man ordained to the diaconate, priesthood or episcopate, and I have seen all three in the past few years. But when a man is ordained, he is never ordained for a particular parish or region. Just because Brian is a native of All Saints, does not mean he belongs to "us." "Us" is a much bigger picture that we sometimes forget to see, because it encompasses a large territory and vast number of people beyond our ordinary experience that we don't see on a day-to-day basis. He will serve where he is needed, and the need is decided by the Bishop with the help of his consultors and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Since we are in the days of waiting for the descent of the Holy Spirit after the Ascension of Our Lord, our prayers must be modeled after those of the Apostles by praying for strength, guidance and courage to tackle the most pressing needs ahead of us. For us, this is for a new generation of priests for our Diocese. I urge all of us to consider how we will actively and prayerfully cultivate a new generation of priests from the pews of our Parish. Since January, two of our active priests – pastors of large parishes in Rochester – died suddenly and unexpectedly. When this happens, the domino effect ensues: when one priest is moved, another has to move as well. Regularly, I am asked how many men we have in the seminary. As of this writing, five men are enrolled at Saint John's Seminary in Boston and two are enrolled at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. Of the seven, two will be ordained to the priesthood on June 5, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. at Sacred Heart Cathedral (Deacon Steven Lewis and Deacon Joseph Maurici.) Two will be completing their seminary training and we may have one young man entering in September. We need many more as our Diocese has twenty priests between 70-80 years old who remain in assignments, almost all as pastors. When these priests step down, if we do not have more young priests in the ranks, it will be very challenging for parishioners and clergy as many consolidations will be necessary very quickly. There may be no pastors with only one site. This includes All Saints.

Encouraging vocations is a Holy Act and a gift to the Church's life. I asked the Parish Council to make this one of the priorities of focus as we prepare to emerge from COVID-19 restrictions and return to "normal activity." Please join in this work as it unfolds. Our Faith depends on it.
