

Good News

Mass of Dedication for St. Mary's Church in 1871

Father McNamara tells us in "A Century of Grace, The History of St. Mary's Roman Catholic Parish" that through great effort Thomas and Margaret Keating were able to encourage their prior parish Priest, Father John Vincent O'Reilly, to come down from Silver Lake, New York to celebrate what would be the areas first Catholic Mass held in the then borough of Corning in 1840. This was also the first Catholic marriage ceremony uniting their daughter Margaret to a John Ryan. Catholic services of any kind were difficult to attend to in the early years locally as available priests had to cover vast territories making anything regular nearly impossible. The creation of the Buffalo Diocese in 1847 would help some. Bishop Timon would visit Corning and conduct several services in February of 1848. During his visit he used the Methodist Church, with their compliments, which once sat on the Southwest corner of Pine and West First Street to a substantial crowd of both Catholics and Protestants. It was during this visit that the Bishop would call for a subscription for a building fund. This modest wood structure would be largely completed by July 24, 1849, at a cost of \$1,200, when Bishop Timon arrived to dedicate it. It would be dedicated to 'Our Lady Help of Christians' which was quickly paraphrased by locals to St. Mary's Church. While having their own priest was out of the question, the Bishop promised Corning it would now have mass once a month.

And so, it would be until Bishop Timon would come again to Corning and establish its own Parish in 1854. The Parish's first Priest was Thomas Cunningham, who previously served out of Elmira with Father John Boyle covering all of Chemung, Wayne, Steuben, and Schuyler Counties at the time. 1860 would usher in the arrival of our second and arguably most influential parish priest, Father Peter Colgan. He came from St Mary's in Dunkirk, New York where he had recently completed the construction of their church building. Father Colgan was known to be engaging, high energy and a personable man who threw himself into his work. Accumulated debts were quickly paid off, a temperance society was established, and a general effort was made to wipe away the local bias against the Irish. Father Colgan had announced his intention to build a new church building in January 1864. Assets for the new building began to be set aside throughout 1864 and a subscription was started in June 1865. \$8,000 was quickly raised but would prove to be a drop in the bucket. Records found at St Mary's Church in Dunkirk indicate that the overall cost of our church was \$75,000 and this was before the sacred elements. Parish fairs, festivals, picnics, games, and suppers supplied a great deal of the funding along with some property lots that were donated by the members of the Corning Company to be sold or raffled off.

With Father Colgan's desire not to take on debt the project took time. Groundbreaking occurred in early 1866. Work progressed with Father Colgan serving as quality control manager, paymaster, foreman and whatever other role would help keep expenses down. By June, activities had progressed such that it was time for the laying of the corner stone. Special trains were requested from both the Fall Brook and Erie Railroad to manage crowds of curiosity seekers. Bishop Timon, who was aging and ill made the trip to Corning from Buffalo for the event on June 10, 1866. This day he would celebrate Mass confirm 208 candidates and bless the church corner stone. Taken from a Century of Grace, the bishop "prayed to God, through the merits of Mary, the Help of Christians, and all the Saints, would favor the church to rise on this spot; and then he blessed the cornerstone and sprinkled it with holy water." From this point the walls would slowly rise. The roof was in place by the Fall of 1867. The building was completed enough to be used as a hall for the annual St. Patrick's Day gathering and fair in March of 1868. It would take another year for the interior to be painted and stenciled but even then, it was still lacking an alter and pews. These items would finally be in place by June of 1870 so the building could take on its new role. With the new Bishop, Stephen V Ryan, at Vatican Council in Rome, formal dedication would have to wait. Vicar General, William Gleeson, would perform the blessing on June 12th 1870 such that the building might be used for sacred purposes. In classic style, Father Colgan not wanting to miss an opportunity, made the occasion a grand full day event for both Catholics and Protestants.

Over a year would pass before Bishop Ryan would make a trip to Corning for the formal dedication. This occasion would be large indeed as a special 6 car train was brought in for the additional hundreds up from Blossburg, Pennsylvania. Both Bishop Stephen Ryan of Buffalo and Bishop Bernard McQuaid of Rochester made the trip to dedicate St. Mary's on October 8th 1871. In the presence of a large crowd at 10:15 Sunday morning, "A Century of Grace" tell us, Ryan "entered the sanctuary of the empty church, blessed the water then proceeded out the front doors with a trail of clergy and around the building" "sprinkling the foundation with holy water." As they went the clergy sang 'Miserere.' Upon return to the front and up to the sanctuary they sang the "Litany of Saints" as parishioners began to fill the pews. The Bishop would go onto say "That thou wouldst deign to purge and bless this church and this altar, for Thy honor and in the name of Saint Mary, Mother of Mercy." From this point the bishop and clerical procession would proceed around the interior blessing the interior walls chanting the 119th, 120th and 121st Psalms. Upon returning to the sanctuary Father Missimo Cassini, President of St. Bonaventure's College would celebrate mass. The Gospel of the day was taken from Matthew 22. The music was Peter's Grand Mass in C performed by St. Mary's Choir along with other songs sung by four soloists and a duet. The day was capped off by the Confirmation of 150 people. Later Bishop McQuaid spoke and was quoted by the Elmira Star Gazette as being "sublimely eloquent" and handled the subject matter "in a masterly manner."

Spirit of the Liturgy Column Michael Plagerman

As we gather on the auspicious occasion of St. Mary's sesquicentennial we witness and celebrate the fullness of our faith manifest in the celebration of the holy sacrifice of the mass by our bishop, successor to the apostles and shepherd of the faithful in this diocese. We also witness, for the first time in over a year, the complete return of liturgical ministries. A sacristan has set the choir (the proper term for the area in which the altar sits) for mass, young altar servers aid Bishop Matano, lectors proclaim the word of God with the deacon proclaiming the gospel. Ushers and greeters extend the spirit of welcome to those who enter this domus dei, porta coeli (house of God, gate of heaven). They will later take up our offerings of thanksgiving and present them and the holy elements to His Excellency. The choir exercises the discipline of musical prayer and musical guidance with us and on our behalf.

All of this happens at one single Mass, and because of its special character we think of all the moving parts that have come together. But, how many fewer people does it actually take to celebrate a usual Sunday mass at All Saints? Three. A normal mass does not have the bishop or the two servers who bear his mitre (hat) and crozier (staff). So, all these groups of people put in work every week so that we can enter into the house of God for prayer and sacrifice in seamless fashion with minimal obstruction from earthly concerns.

Some time ago, Father granted me a place in his Good News article to highlight the many liturgical ministry groups at All Saints. A few people stepped into volunteer roles as a result of that, but many more are needed! I am delighted to have the opportunity, from now on, to write in this column about all things musical and liturgical. The first several weeks will be notes from the heads of each of our liturgical ministries: sacristans, lectors, altar servers, art and environment, ushers/greeters, and audio/visual recording.

Each of these dedicated members of our congregation are working to strengthen, grow, and educated those who give of their time and talents to God through service to the parish. Without these leaders and the volunteers who work with them our weekly celebration would be diminished. I am immensely grateful to be working with them and witnessing the Holy Spirit in their efforts and those of their groups.

Next week's article will be authored by Amanda Chafee. She will pen about the important and critical role our Ushers/Greeters ministry play.






