Healing in His Wings

“To you who fear My name The Sun of Righteousness shall arise with healing in His wings” (Mal 4:2)

It’s hard to believe that we are in the middle of January already! I pray the new year is going well for everyone so far. We were so very blessed as a parish to have the Missionary Image of our Lady of Guadalupe with us during the month of December and especially over Christmas. We also have received wonderful compliments about the healing service that was conducted on Dec 11th with the Image, and as a result, I would like to follow up on the topic of healing.

I was blessed to attend a 3-day retreat near Philadelphia right before Christmas with a renown healing priest and exorcist. During this retreat, several hundred people came forward for prayer requesting physical, emotional, and spiritual healing. I believe all were touched in one way or another. It was so great to see souls experience the healing, mercy, love, and peace of God.

The Scripture tells us that God’s Word is forever settled in heaven (Ps. 119:89) and that it is living and active, piercing into the spirit, soul, joint and marrow. (Heb 4:12). The healing we see in God’s Word, especially all throughout the Gospels, was not just limited to the biblical times, but is available for us today. All healing comes through the Eternal Word Himself and when God became man, He provided a way not only for the eternal salvation of our souls, but a remedy for our physical ailments. The famous prophecy in the book of Isaiah declares that Jesus borne our griefs and carried our sorrows, and that He was wounded for our transgressions, bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes (wounds) we are healed. (Is 53:4-5). This is a very important prophecy for it carries the healing and wholeness of our entire being in Him. The Hebrew word in this specific passage for grief is **choli** (pronounced khol-ee) meaning diseases or sicknesses, and the Hebrew word for sorrows is **makob** meaning pains. Jesus literally bore our diseases, sicknesses, and pains in His atonement and as the passage continues, we are healed by His wounds.

I think we tend to concentrate primarily on the healing of the soul, which is extremely important, but it would be a mistake to do that to the exclusion of the body. Both are encompassed in our Lord’s saving passion. So, if that is the case then why are not more people seemingly healed? First, we must remember that God is Sovereign, and in His own infinite wisdom, He knows what is best for us. Sometimes He allows certain situations in our lives to work out a far better weight of glory, or possibly there is a work that needs to yet be done in us. However, that does not mean healing doesn’t happen or that it is not His will, for it is natural and God given that we want to be healed.

In 2019, Pope Francis established the Sunday of the Word of God to be celebrated each year on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. As the Holy Father stated in his apostolic letter instituting the observance, “Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world” (Aperuit illis, no. 2.)

To celebrate the “**Sunday of the Word of God,**” the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has prepared a series of videos in English and Spanish by renowned Catholic biblical scholars. The videos will address the Bible’s authorship, the canon of Scripture, a Catholic approach to reading the Bible, the practice of lectio divina, and the synoptic Gospels. You can access the videos, along with discussion guides and suggestions for further reading at catholic.bible.

On January 23, 2023, in observance of the Sunday of the Word of God, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, through a grant from the American Bible Society, will offer a “Sunday Seminar Series” of five videos about Sacred Scripture in the life of the Church. These videos, available in English and Spanish, will feature some of the most renowned biblical scholars in the United States and will be accompanied by discussion/reflection questions and suggestions for further reading.

When we get sick we don't say "well I guess it is God's Will" and don't do anything about it. No, we go to the doctor. Even though sickness happens, we nonetheless first try and remedy it. The same goes for supernatural healing and miracles. We should always ask for healing whether it eventually comes or not. Chances are it will my friends.

I think we all know the Lord can heal, but the question may be is it His will to heal? In the Gospel of Matthew, we see a leper coming to Jesus and asking for healing. He says, "Lord if you are willing, you can make me clean." (Mk 1:40). Notice that the leper acknowledges that the Lord can heal him but was not sure if it was His will to heal him. Jesus then responds with "I am willing" and then He healed him. So, we see the Lord is indeed willing and this willingness is based on His mercy and compassion, for the same verse tells us this...." Then Jesus, moved with compassion, stretched out His hand and touched him" (Mk.1:41).

We see all sorts of healings in the Gospels such as Matt. 8:16-17 which says, "when evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed, and He cast out the spirits with a word and healed all who were sick that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: **"He Himself took our infirmities, and bore our sicknesses."** This is the exact reference to the Isaiah passage I mentioned in the beginning of this article. So, a question for us. Did the Lord change from the days when He walked the earth to now? Not at all, because as Scripture tells us, Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever (Heb 13:8). So, if He is willing to heal then, He is willing to heal now.

We need to avail ourselves to His healing power that He wants to bring to us. We need to build our faith to receive it and one way we can do that is to spend time in His Word. I suggest taking the below scripture passages and read them carefully, meditating upon them and letting them soak in. For if you do, indeed the Word will penetrate and pierce into the very core of your being, causing faith to arise!

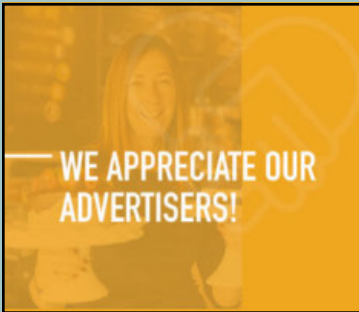
