WHAT IS LENT FOR YOU?

We just concluded Christmastide (Christmas season) with the Baptism of the Lord. We started the ordinary time with the second Sunday of the ordinary time of the church calendar that soon will come to a temporary hold with the celebration of the seventh Sunday of ordinary time, until after the end of Easter.

On Ash Wednesday we begin the season of lent which will last forty days, which are days of fasting and prayer, for those who are fourteen years old to fifty nine years old.

During Ash Wednesday we will be applying ashes on the forehead to remind us of our need to repent and believe in the gospel or from dust you came and to dust you shall return.

Why fast, we fast to be strengthened spiritually and be prepared to go through the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we fast, so that whatever we self-deny may be used for charity to help the less fortunate in the community and in the society at large. We fast because we need to be closer to Jesus Christ in our Journey to heaven.

What to fast from? You fast from what you like, what you feel that it will help make a difference in society and improve your spiritual journey.

Apart from preparing ourselves for the spiritual warfare, we also fast since we are following the example of Jesus Christ who after the Baptism at the river Jordan was driven by the Holy Spirit into the desert to pray and fast while focusing on the work that lay ahead of Him of the public ministry.

Lenten Series on the Mass


Wednesdays of Lent – 7:00pm (Brennan Chapel St. Mary's Church)
