In the context of coming together in preparation for the Passover celebration. Jesus had a meal with his disciples and in that meal, he called it the Last supper.

"On the first day of the feast of unleavened bread, the disciples approached Jesus and said, "where do you want us to prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He said, Go into the city to a certain man an tell him. The teacher says, "my appointed time draws near: in your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples." "The disciples then did as Jesus had ordered and prepared the Passover. *MT*. 26:21-19.

While they were eating Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it and giving it to his disciples said take and eat, this is my body. Then he took the cup gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying drink from it all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant which will be shed for the forgiveness of sins. - Oversees the Creating A Safe Environment (CASE) training, documentation, and reporting procedures for the Parish. This is accomplished by working directly with the Office Assistant and Ministry Leaders to assure all volunteers are following CASE directives.
- Maintain office records such as attendance, expenses, Catechists training, and Sacramental records.
- Expected to attend staff meetings in the Parish and regionally, as well as Diocesan meetings and activities offered by the Dept. Of Evangelization and Catechists, throughout the year.

### **Qualifications:**

- Applicant should (minimally) be certified as a Catechetical Coordinator or be willing to become certified.
- They should have strong technological and organizational skills.
- They should be able to lead and motivate children and work collaboratively with parents and other staff members.

### **Training and Development:**

• Professional Development training is available and provided by the Diocesan Office of Evangelization and Catechesis, both online and in-person.
