



#### A Note from Father Zach:

Happy Easter! As we enter the third week of Easter, the readings tell us Jesus has Risen from the dead and appears to the disciples who are often gathered together as a community.



This weekend the disciples are remembering how they experienced Jesus in the breaking of the bread but it was only after the fact that they realized it was him. Today Jesus joins the disciples again and brings the message of peace. When they first see Jesus again they didn't realize it was him until they ate with him again. The message Jesus brings this weekend is that as Christians we experience Christ through the Eucharist, community and personal experience. It's through Jesus that Christians are one.

In our current situation it's hard to be a community and to share in fellowship, but even in the difficulties of life we are still a community. As we are one community, we need your help. ## **REFLECTION PAGE**

A Reflection by Deacon Tom Cuskey

"Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away." With those words from today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter calls on those in the Jewish community of Jerusalem who were responsible for the death of Christ to seek forgiveness. The mercy is not for their role in the Crucifixion; Peter knows they were ignorant of their role's true purpose and their actions were a necessary part of the Father's plan for salvation. They need to repent and convert to take their place among those who will find everlasting joy through the salvation Christ brought us, just as we repent when we avail ourselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The real challenge posed to us today is the other call Peter makes , the one to conversion. "Why me," you may ask, "I'm already a Catholic Christian? I don't need to convert!" Are you certain of that?

When I was a boy my father owned a Cadillac that was parked beside our house. A Cadillac in the mid-1960's was a big deal if you were a car-guy like my old man. Looked great. I'd sit in it and pretend to drive. My father didn't seem to mind because the car never ran. It looked like a Cadillac, parked like a Cadillac but it didn't drive like a Cadillac...it didn't drive at all! Many of us were baptized to be Christians, we come to church like Christians but don't live the lives that Christ truly calls us to as His disciples. Only when we love God above all else, treat others as we would treat ourselves and act toward those on the margins of society as brothers and sisters can we truly be called Christian. I know I always need to work on that. How about you? "Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."
