"JUST DECISION"

We can often hear people comment that "life is not fair." Often this comment comes when we don't get our own way. The measuring stick is not justice but a very subjective desire to have it our way. In Jesus' parable the widow is persistent in coming to the judge and asking for a "just decision". We are told that the judge 'neither feared God nor respected any human being. It would leave one to question what objective criterion is used by the judge in handing down judgments? He most likely passes judgments based on personal preference or benefit. In our country judges are to hand down judgments in accordance with the law, interpreting the law with respect to judicial precedent. This shows that a judge does have respect for the decisions made by other judges in the past with similar cases. In the end the judge does give a "just decision" in the case because he is concerned for his personal well-being. He is fearful that the widow may come and "strike me." Although he give a "just decision" he does it for the wrong reason.

God on the other hand is the "just judge". It is of God's nature to act with justice especially towards his people. In the first reading we are told that "Amalek came and waged war against Israel." Amalek is the bully on the school play ground. He is bigger and stronger than Israel and yet he seeks out Israel and wages war. Israel defends itself against this aggression. God, acts on behalf of the weaker people. Israel turns to God for help and God does not fail. The covenant is confirmed, "I will be your God. You will be my people."

St Paul reminds us that we must remember the covenant God has made with us. God uses Sacred Scripture to reveal himself to us. As the just judge, God knows that justice demands that His creation know Him. The Bible is not just a nice collection of stories from the past. Stories written by just anyone. God in His justice has given us His own words. He is the divine author who has used human beings to write down His story. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, they have been instruments of God's will in their writings. We do not need to guess what God wants, who God is or if God is present to us. God has told us all of this in the Sacred Scriptures. Justice demands that we be given the opportunity to know our creator, savior and sanctifier. While God provides for us the question remains; Will we follow God? Will we listen to His word? Will we place our trust and hope in God? Jesus asks; But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth? What will your answer be?
