FEAST OF MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD

January 1st is the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God. Growing up we always went to Mass on New Years Day and I always thought that it was because it would be a good way to start the New Year by thanking God for the many blessing He has given us and asking for His continued blessings in the year ahead. That seemed very logical to me and a good thing to do.

As I became more familiar with my Catholic Faith, I became aware that January 1st was a Holy Day of Obligation in the Church, the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God. Why is this date so important especially as it comes just one week after the feast of Christmas?
