"BAPTISM"

Who can be baptized? The Sacrament of Baptism has been entrusted to the Church by God as a gift to be treasured and administered to those who seek union with God in Jesus Christ. The sacrament can be received by adults and children who freely seek the sacrament, promise to actively participate in the life of the Church and have been prepared to make a profession of faith. In the Baptism ritual the adult, or a child over the age of seven years, will be asked to reject evil and profess their belief in God. In the case of a child younger than seven years of age the parents and godparents must make the promise to raise the child in the practice of the faith and then profess their own belief in the faith of the Catholic Church. Here are the questions which are asked to receive the profession of faith:

- 1) Do you renounce Satan?
- 2) And all his works?
- 3) And all his empty promises?
- 4) Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?
- 5) Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?
- 6) Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life ever lasting?

These questions are not to be answered lightly. As we have said; Baptism is very serious business. A matter of life and death. Eternal life and death for those who make the promises.

Some people today do not believe in Satan. TV and the movies have trivialized Satan and his influence in our world. Satan and evil have become the subject of too many shows, movies and digital games. People view Satan to be another character in the movies. Just an imaginary being. The Church has been entrusted with the message that Satan exercises his evil influence in the world to draw people away from God. He sugar coats evil to make it appear attractive to the human person. He tries to convince us, just as he did our first parents, to doubt God's sincerity and love for us. He lures us to think that his ways justifies the means. That getting what we want is more important than doing what God wants and helping to meet the needs of our brothers and sisters.

Parents and sponsors (godparents) must teach about and protect our children from Satan and his agents in the world. They have promised God to care for these children. To raise them in the practice of their Roman Catholic faith.
