#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Due to an early bulletin deadline because of the Christmas holiday, I am writing this column on Saturday, December 11th - 2 weeks before Christmas! At this time, we are looking forward to our celebrations of our Christmas liturgies. I hope that you had a very Merry Christmas, and that you have and will be spending time this week with those you love.

Today, this day after Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. I have always thought that the placing of this feast - on the weekend following Christmas - was appropriate as many families are gathered together for the celebration of Christmas. It is a wonderful time to celebrate together and renew family acquaintances. Today is also a day to offer a prayer of thanks for our families. There have been many lessons learned during these many months of enduring this pandemic, and one lesson that has been learned by many is the importance of family.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph are central figures of the Christmas season. When reading the scriptural accounts about the Nativity, you will find that God was very much a part of each person's life. God sent the angel Gabriel to Mary and she said "Yes"; then God sent Gabriel to Joseph to fill him in on God's plan, and Joseph said "Yes". # FROM THE FINANCE COUNCIL Tax Advantaged Donation Strategies

In addition to donating with cash or checks, there are other tax beneficial ways that you can donate to St. Mary Our Mother:

If you are over age 70-1/2 and you have an IRA retirement account, you may be eligible for a tax benefit called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This provision in the tax law allows you to make a distribution from your IRA directly to a qualified non-profit organization. Using the QCD option, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year to charity and exclude the entire distribution from your gross income for tax purposes. If you are over age 72, the QCD will also count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year. Please consult with your tax accountant for specific tax advice.

If you have appreciated securities, you may be able to save money on capital gains taxes by donating shares to a qualified non-profit organization. You can transfer stocks, bonds, mutual funds or exchange traded funds (ETF) positions that have appreciated in value as a charitable gift. Please consult with your tax accountant for specific tax advice.

# THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

Families can be very difficult things to negotiate. This is true not only of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our Church, our society, and our global family as well. Everything human can be found in family stories. Those stories speak of wonderful life-giving successes as well as painful spirit-robbing abuses. Our greatest joys and our greatest wounds are usually connected with the experience of family. Our needs, experiences, and unresolved baggage often color what we bring to our familiar relationships. They contribute to our level of defensiveness, how guarded and protected we become, and what prejudices we believe.

In order to break the cycle of dysfunction we have to remember that it is not only by human effort that we negotiate the difficult and challenging events of our lives. There is a Divine Effort at work as well. For sure, the human effort can create quite a mess and easily destroy lives. This is true of any family with which we are associated. Today's Feast of the Holy Family serves to help us understand that there is a Divine Story being told as well. It is a story of perseverance in the face of hardship, determination in the face of despair, healing when we see nothing but wounds, and light where there is darkness.

Do we believe that God is always working, guiding, restoring, and leading? Unless we do, we will never be free from the imperfections and wounds that bind us and never

be able to understand what it really means to forgive. Pope Francis tells us that the "light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth to other families." While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually unfolding story of love. The Holy Family persevered and radiated warmth because they knew they were not alone. We can too.
