Pastoral Perspectives

I think the adage about not appreciating something until you lose it is most obvious and difficult when it is the power --- electrical power --- that you lose. Even if for a small amount of time, it seems like the world comes to an end. Have you had the experience of knowing that there is no electricity in the house, but still, by habit, turn on the room switch in a dark room, expecting the overhead ceiling light to go on? Then find yourself saying, "Why did I do that? The power is off!"

I always discover when the power finally returns, how dependent I am on the refrigerator, electric oven, computer and TV screens, electric can openers, computer printers, radios, ---- but most especially, for the electric lights!

For without the ceiling light, the kitchen light, the hallway light, the living room lights, the bedroom lights --- and especially the bathroom light --- how difficult would it be living in darkness!

Have we accepted the light of Jesus? Have we allowed the "power to go on?" or do we prefer to stay in the land of gloom, to sit in the darkness?

Have we allowed obsession with our work, our relationships, our routines to keep us in the dark? Are we sucked into our social networking, the gadgetry of iPads and cell phones that we cannot hear the voice of Jesus calling us through our spouses, children, prayer, or others beyond our familiar circle?

Viktor Frankel, the author of *Mans's Search for Meaning*, was a Jew who spent three years at Auschwitz, Dachau, and other concentration camps during World War II. He survived the atrocities of Auschwitz by giving meaning to focusing on a light in a farmhouse he could see in the distance from the concentration camp. Could opening up our own


darkness to let the light of Jesus in, be also for each of us, a way of walking in the light of hope and peace?

Some today speak gloomily of the future, concerned as we should be, about diseases. discrimination, oppression, injustice, and war. But the Second Vatican Council reminded us years ago that the Church must be a leaven, a kind of soul for human society as it is renewed in Christ and transformed into God's family ... the Church not only communicates divine life to men [and women], but in some way casts the reflected light of that life over the entire earth (GS, 40).

A writer once said: "There's so much [light] to be squeezed into the cracks of one little day. You can make someone laugh, smile, hope, sing, think. The most important day of the year isn't ... your anniversary or your birthday. It's the day you are in, so live the (heck) out of that day alone. "The people who lived in darkness have seen a great light."

HOW IMPORTANT IS BAPTISM?

It is in this sacrament that Christ claims us for his own; that parents commit to raising their child as a Christian; and that the Christian community welcomes the child as a member. What an awesome gift parents give their child when they come to the Church to ask for this sacrament of Baptism for their child!

It is a serious responsibility of the faith community to help parents in every way possible. Here at St. Theodore's we offer an individual meeting with parents to talk together about the privileges and responsibilities of Baptism and a group session that further explores how both parents and Church can help form this child in our Catholic faith.

If you are expecting, we encourage you to attend this class during your pregnancy, so you have as much of a "head start" as possible in forming your child in faith. If you have a newborn, we urge you to participate in this group session in the early months of your child's life. Arrange an appointment by calling the parish office at 429-6811. SYNOD 2021-23

At the Vatican's October 10, 2021 opening mass for the launching of the Synod 2021-23, Pope Francis urged the global Catholic Church to master the "art of encounter." "Everything changes once we are capable of genuine encounters with [Jesus] and with one another, without formalism or pretense, but simply as we are... Do we allow people to express themselves, to walk in faith even though they have had difficulties in life, and to be part of the life of the community without being hindered, rejected or judged?" 

The prayer service, flowing from the Year of St. Joseph declared by Pope Francis in 2021, and inspired by his apostolic letter Patris Corde, is sponsored by Knights of Columbus Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, Council to honor St.


