Sacrament of Baptism.

The sacrament through which God, in Jesus Christ, makes us His sons and daughters. To prepare for

reception, call Father Edison @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of the Eucharist. The sacrament through which God, like a responsible parent, feeds us, with food from heaven: His Word, and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

- Family members may bring Holy Communion to other family members who are sick and homebound.

Sacrament of Confirmation. The sacrament through which God by the gift of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to give faithful witness to our Catholic Faith. To prepare for reception, call Elizabeth Johnston @ 924-2800.

- Children, older than 7 y/o, and adults who needs to be baptized, receive Communion and/or be Confirmed, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass.* Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

On the Eucharist



Results of the Second Survey on the Eucharist. Only fifteen participated. All participants engage in the ongoing Respect and Reverence Challenge, which began last January. Fourteen attend Mass every

Sunday; and one, twice a month.

Some of the things that they do to express respect and reverence towards the Holy Mass: *attending daily Mass, attending Sunday Mass and holy days of obligation, serving as liturgical minister, being more attentive to their attire at Mass, doing personal reflection on the Sunday readings, continuing the discussion on the homily after Mass, and staying after Mass for personal prayer.*

What other ways can our parish support your spiritual and liturgical renewal? *Spiritual retreats, after Mass social gatherings, Bible Study, promote beauty in the Eucharist, homilies that are Bible-based and applicable to everyday life, use of traditional hymns, and the observance of silence during Mass.*

What have you appreciated more about the Mass with its celebration versus populum? *Better understanding of the community, and able to see the facial expressions and gestures of the presider.*

...and ad orientem? *Participating more in union with the priest, stronger sense of unity in prayer, paying more attention to the Eucharistic Prayer, understanding the role of the ordained priest, Fr. Edison is one with the congregation when we are all facing in the same way, more spiritually fulfilling experience, develop a stronger connection with God at such an important moment at Mass.*

Next Steps...

We will continue to alternate the *versus populum* and *ad orientem* postures during the Eucharistic Prayer. I pray that this will continue to challenge us to pay more and more attention to the things that could easily be taken for granted and to the things that need rediscovery. I myself continually find that I am seeing more what is happening at Mass, particularly what God is doing for us at Mass.

And how are we affected by Pope Francis' *motu proprio Traditionis custodes*? Bishop Matano allows for the celebration of the Extraordinary Form of the Mass to continue where it was previously offered in the diocese prior to the release of the *motu proprio*.

Continue to remain respectful and reverent toward the Holy Mass.



Vocation Corner

Vocation comes from the Latin word *vocare*, which means "to call." Vocation points to the reality of the God who calls us to Himself. The Bible attests to the God who speaks. The Bible is correctly referred to as the Word of God. That God calls us presupposes that God created us with the capacity to listen to Him and to respond to Him.

Foster Silence. For the month of August, prayerfully develop the habit of fostering silence every day. For teens and adults. Begin with fifteen minutes. During these fifteen minutes, spend the first half, reading the Gospel for the day. And the next half, adopt a silent posture and simply listen to what God has to say to you.

For little children. Parents, begin with three to five minutes of silence. Gather them around your prayer corner at home. Have them seated. During this time, they may focus on their favorite religious image. Or have them rest their head on you, while doing this invite them to imagine that they are resting their head on God's shoulder or Jesus' chest.

In past years, when we brought teens to YPWC in Frenchville, PA. Everyday, teens were given an hour of silence. During the hour, they can do whatever they want that expresses their desire to be with God: walk in grounds, read the Bible or a religious book, spend time in the chapel, etc. By the end of the week, it is amazing how many teens wanted to continue at home this practice of observing silence.

May we be intentional in creating silence in our lives, every day. In these moments of silence, may we hear more clearly the voice of God. In response, may we have the humility and courage to respond with, "Here I am, Lord!"

Let us rebuild the Church by nurturing a culture of vocations!


Children's Choir

Let there be light...

Jesus Christ: Our Reference Point

Brothers and sisters:

*So be imitators of God, as beloved children,
and live in love, as Christ loved us...*

- Ephesians 5:1-2

In the challenging verses to follow, it is good to put them in their proper context, by going to the initial verses of chapter 5. As Christian disciples, we cannot be content by simply being ourselves. We must become like God, as loved by God, as loved by Christ, and as a consequence, to live according to our experience of divine love.

Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord.

*For the husband is head of his wife
just as Christ is head of the church,
he himself the savior of the body.*

As the church is subordinate to Christ,

so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything.

- Ephesians 5:21, 22-24

To better understand verse 21, we need to refer to Matthew 20:28, "...the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many...", and John 15:20, "No slave is greater than his master," and Galatians 2:19-20, "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me..." That Christians can and must place ourselves subordinate to one another is made possible by Jesus Himself. He set Himself as our example. And His example has to begin from within us - because Jesus lives in us and us in Him.

In these verses, subordination should be understood within its given context, love! First, the love of God, and secondly, the love of Christians for one another, as we imitate the love of God.

If and when we accept our subordination to one another, it would be easier to understand and accept the subordination of wives to their husbands, of course, within the context of marriage.

*Husbands, love your wives,
even as Christ loved the church*

*and banded himself over for her to sanctify her,
cleansing her by the bath of water with the word,
that he might present to himself the church in splendor,
without spot or wrinkle or any such thing,
that she might be holy and without blemish.*

So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies.

He who loves his wife loves himself.

*For no one hates his own flesh
but rather nourishes and cherishes it,
even as Christ does the church,
because we are members of his body.*

*For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother
and be joined to his wife,
and the two shall become one flesh.*

- Ephesians 5:25-31

What is the goal of subordination out of love for Christ? Holiness! What is the goal of loving with the sacrificial love of Christ for the Church? Holiness!

Keep your parish staff in your daily prayers.

Our radical and profound identity in Christ must lead us to love *like Christ* and to love *the other as Christ*. Seeing this wonderful reality first among Christian disciples, it may make more sense when it is applied to husbands and wives.

To be able to do this, may we pray for the grace to experience the sacrificial love of Christ and for the grace to see others as members of the Body of Christ, worthy of our own sacrificial love.

This is a great mystery,

but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

- Ephesians 5:32

How simple yet how difficult. God has kept it simple for us by setting Himself as the example. But because it is of God, it is mysterious - it will not make sense according to the ways and logic of the world.

The fifth chapter of the Letter to the Ephesians is worth re-reading. It confronts the ways and logic of the world. It seeks to deepen our understanding of Christ's sacrificial love for us, His Church.
