Joseph's Workbench



Finances: We recently had our Finance Council meeting and there were some interesting facts.

First, we recently made our Hope Appeal, actually we went \$5,000 dollars above our goal! Only about half (300) of our regular givers gave to the Hope Appeal. We made it "over the top" for our goal because of one or two generous donors who gave more. If all 600 of our regular donors gave to the Hope Appeal, we could make our goal easily. By the way, a portion of whatever we give above our goal comes back to the parish.

We are in budget on our giving, but things aren't all rosy. As I noted above, we have about 600 regular givers, which is great. However, that's less than half of the parishioners listed on our census. Not everyone can give, but if everyone who could give gave something our financial worries would be over.

The greatest gift you can give us is your presence. Coming personally to Mass, with the proper precautions, means Mass is one of the safest public events you can attend. There's no substitute to praying together, in person, as God's people.

Legacies: We recently received notice of two parishioners who have recognized us in their wills. We will gratefully remember these people in prayer. The amount we will receive is uncertain, we'll know more when the finances of each estate are resolved. These funds are not part of our regular income and will be saved for future expenses. Our physical plant needs work, the church roof, as noted elsewhere in this bulletin, has gotten recent work but will need to be replaced in the next few years, there are also the doors of the church, which are showing their age, and the church phone system, which is limping along.

Please consider remembering St. Joseph's in your estate planning. Any gift, small or large, helps, and you can't take it with you!

Winter Olympics: The Winter Olympics from Beijing, China will start Feb. 2nd and the opening ceremony will be on Feb. 4th. I wish the athletes well. I will not be watching. The Communist government of China is committing genocide against the Uyghur people of northwest China. Concentration camps, forced sterilization, and killings are all part of this campaign. The Tibetan people are also being oppressed as are Catholics and the people of Hong Kong. The democratic island of Taiwan is being threatened with invasion.

Perhaps if enough people boycott and refuse to watch these games, while supporting the athletes, a message will be sent to China that its abuse of human rights are unacceptable. Perhaps the Olympics will consider the human rights record in future host countries.

A winter rescue: Last Sunday our parish experienced a winter rescue, not of a person, but of our boilers! John Schleier, half of our maintenance staff, was at the 8:00am Mass and noticed how chilly it was. He contacted Dan Murray, our head of maintenance and an experienced HVAC technician, and John checked out the boiler room. A pipe had frozen, if it had been left alone we would have lost both boilers, thousands of dollars to replace them, and had weeks without heat! God bless John and Dan, great save! I've told John I should take him out to a local and buy him a boilermaker!

Being Strong



As the first reading describes it, when the Jews—newly returned to Jerusalem from captivity in Babylon—listened to Ezra read God's word, they were minded to weep.

Who can blame them? Everything around them was so far from what it ought to be, from what God planned it to be, from what they themselves

wanted it to be. All around them lay the ruins of what Israel and Jerusalem and the Temple and God's people had once been and were meant to be.

And who among us fails to understand their attitude? We look at the mess we have made of the earth, and we are so discouraged. We see the unspeakable suffering of the afflicted, and we groan inwardly for our world. We look at the Church itself, which ought to be the light of the whole broken world; and we are tempted to despair. We turn inward to our own hearts and what we see there makes us want to be invisible to others. In safe and quiet moments we are minded to weep too, like the Jews of Ezra's time.

And so the last line of the First Reading is more than a little surprising: the joy of the Lord is our strength!

It is, of course, not surprising to hear that we must be strong. When everything lies in ruins around you, you can't afford not to be strong.

But being strong is a matter of grim determination and hard work, isn't it? Not according to the first reading! It tells us that our strength lies in joy.

In fact, joy is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit. When a person opens to God, and the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in him, then that person becomes fruitful; and joy is one of the fruits he bears. Because the God he loves is present in him, he has joy in the presence of his beloved Lord.

But if the Lord himself is with us and for us, what can be against us?

And so the prayer of St. Patrick makes sense: Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me ... I arise today through the mighty strength of the Lord.

Who would not rejoice surrounded in this way by the Lord? This is strength indeed.

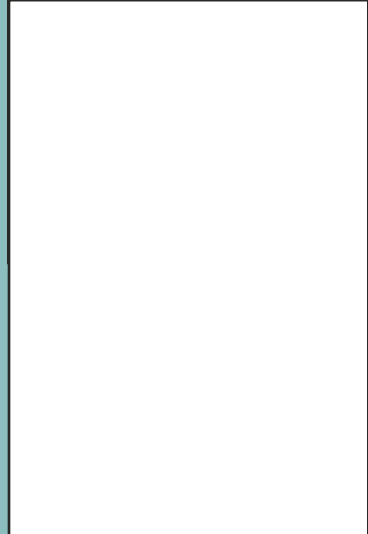
