Well....no longer!

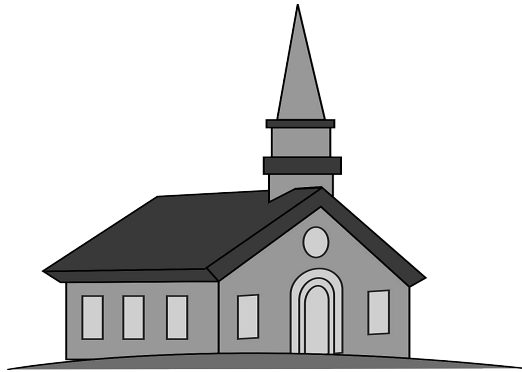
