Mass for the People of Afghanistan

Our Lady of Peace Church

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time
August 29, 2021

From Father Clemente:

As everyone knows, the situation in Afghanistan is very bad. The one thing that all of us can do to help these suffering people is to pray for them. As Americans, we are often insulated and unaffected by how much suffering there is in other places on earth. We complain about the slightest inconveniences when there are fellow humans who are being slaughtered or have lost their homes, have no food or clean water, or are in a war zone. The people of Afghanistan are suffering more than you or I can imagine.

I invite you to join me on **Tuesday, August 31st at 6:30 PM at Our Lady of Peace** to celebrate Mass for the people of Afghanistan and for a just and humane solution to the situation. I believe that our prayer has power to invoke God's mercy and providential care. Just a note to Solvay territory parishioners. You won't have any problem driving through the Fair area since the numbers and traffic are very low. There has been no waiting or traffic jams because of the low numbers of attendees.

I published the Summary Financial Report in last week's bulletin and at this writing I have not heard a single comment from anyone. My first comment is one of thanksgiving to all of you who have continued to be generous and regular with your financial support of the parish. You have been wonderful in getting your offerings to us by mail, online, by bringing them to the locked mail box in front of the Parish Office Building and through the collection taken at Sunday Mass. You are the backbone and strength of our parish. Since Covid-19, expenses have been a bit lower due to lack of activities but we have started to have a few more activities lately. We have cut some hours of the parish employees to save money. At this point there is really nothing more that can be cut.

Looking at the bottom line of the report you can see that we had a loss of \$21,423. What concerns me is that without the rental income from the former Rectory at Our Lady of Peace our loss would have been \$42,833. The rental income was about 50% of the deficit we would have had without that rental income. As I said in last week's bulletin article, and is worth repeating, if our income had been about 5% higher we would not have had a loss. The other factor is that we need to generate rental income to compensate for income that does not come from the regular collection.

As I said to a member of the parish staff, it isn't rocket science to see that we are dipping into savings every year to make the expenses. Doing this every year weakens our financial stability. I ask you to try to understand what is going on here and respond as a united community that cares about your future.

I know that there are several people who are watching Mass online or on TV. This was a very good thing when we were shut down and couldn't attend Mass in person. The problem now is that there are many people who got out of the habit of Sunday Mass and haven't come back. This is a major concern of mine. I know that the other pastors of the Diocese have the same concern. There is no significant danger in attending Mass at this time. One can do so without any physical contact with persons or contaminated things. We sanitize regularly and are very careful about contacts that would communicate disease. Vessels are sanitized and kept covered during Mass for your safety. Communion is distributed in a safe manner.

The major issue of our time is to change the Godless attitude of people. It seems that even old people have lost reverence for God and holy things. There is hope in that there are some young people who are looking to reclaim traditional values and worship. They look for churches where the liturgy is celebrated with reverence and dignity. They look for what is tried and true rather than what is innovative and always changing. That's why there has been a revival in the Latin Mass, traditional devotions and prayers, and "ad orientem" (priest facing the altar) celebration of the Mass. The irony is that 75 year olds hate it and 22 year olds love it. It makes me shake my head. One would think it would be just the opposite.

Whatever the case, we have to reunite the Church in faith and in worship. We have to reach out in charity and with welcome to all people and help them to see the effects of the love of God in their lives and His care for them. When parishes are welcoming people come back and find a spiritual home. When they're cliquy and unfriendly visitors do not come back a second time. We have to find it in ourselves to welcome visitors and give them a reason to come back. We have to invite those who have no faith tradition to be welcomed into the Church through the RCIA process. It is always available at our parish. You just have to contact the Parish Office and you can connect anyone to this process. I continually try to promote our youth ministry. There is something for every age group of youth. Yet I still get parishioners asking me why we don't have anything for youth. We do! We do! We do! Just ask!

As Fall approaches, let us focus on the health of our parish and promote its strengths and create a happier and more grace-filled environment for people to find God and their salvation.
