FATHER JIM'S WISE & OTHERWISE


Make better use of opportunities we're given

Baptism information session a must for parents

Baptism is the first sacrament of initiation. It is a beautiful ceremony that welcomes the baby (or adult) into the Catholic faith and to free them from the original sin that we were all born with. It links you to the grace and love of God. Symbols of water, light and oil are used.

We have begun a new program for families who will be baptizing their child in our church. All parents who would like their child to receive the Sacrament of Baptism must attend a preparation session before their child is baptized. The session occurs from 6:30 to 7:30

p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month in the Salerno Room.

The first baptism prep hour will be Tuesday, Feb. 1. When you contact the rectory (315-735-1482) to set up your child's baptism, you also will set up the baptism prep session as well. The baptism session explains the sacrament, its symbols and meaning and much more.

It is not common to make decisions in this way. But remember, we live in a world and in a time when bad decisions are being made often. Perhaps we need to find a new way to make decisions? Perhaps this process will help us consider difficult issues with deeper understanding and with more compassion.

Difficult issues are not always just twosided: right or wrong. Difficult issues have many layers. The synod process can help reveal many layers of issues and it can bring us closer to each other as we search together for answers.

Even if you decide not to attend a synod meeting, pray for the success of the synod process.
