Clustering Part Four: Embracing the Future with Hope

What does it entail to have an Effectively Administered Parish (Leadership)? The Church's mission in the world is the responsibility of all the baptized, thereby making the parish's mission and ministry a collaborative endeavor, requiring the gifts and talents of all the faithful. Furthermore, the parish needs sufficient physical and human resources to fulfill its mission. According to Vatican II document the Pastor needs to consult with the laity who in turn have the right to express their views and concerns to him. An important structure initiated to foster this collaboration in the mission of the Church by all its members is the **Parish Pastoral Council**. The Parish Pastoral Council assists pastors in achieving the cooperation of the parishioners and staff in the task of carrying out the mission of the Church on the parish level. It clearly states that "... by reason of the knowledge, competence or pre-eminence which they have, the laity are empowered, indeed sometimes obliged, to manifest their opinion in those things which pertain to the good of the Church. If the occasion should arise, this should be done through the institutions established by the Church for that purpose and always with truth, courage and prudence and with reverence and charity towards those who by reason of their office, represent the person of Christ."

The 1983 Code of Canon Law calls for the Pastor to develop structures which incorporate the principles of collaborative responsibility and of consultation with the staff and parishioners. "The pastor is the proper shepherd of the parish entrusted to him, exercising pastoral care in the community entrusted to him under the authority of the diocesan bishop in whose ministry of Christ he has been called to share; in accord with the norm of law he carries out for his community the duties of teaching, sanctifying and governing, with the cooperation of other presbyters or deacons and the assistance of lay members of the Christian faithful (canon 519). Therefore, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish; the pastor presides over it, and through it the Christian faithful along with those who share in the pastoral care of the parish in virtue of their office give their help in fostering pastoral activity. This pastoral council possesses a consultative vote only and is governed by norms determined by the diocesan bishop. It is envisioned that the Parish Pastoral Council is to be a major consultative body in the parish which advises the Pastor who presides over the Council. It is composed of the Parochial Vicar(s) and representative parish staff members who carry out the pastoral functions of the parish and of laity who are representatives of the membership of the parish. The Parish Pastoral Council is pastoral in nature, because it strives to discern the movement of the Holy Spirit among God's people in the parish. A Parish Pastoral Council gives its help to the pastor in fostering pastoral activity; it investigates, under the authority of the pastor, all those things which pertain to pastoral works to ponder them, and to propose practical conclusions about them. It is essential that Council meetings occur in the context of prayer and openness to the Holy Spirit, so that at all times the common good will prevail.

A good and effective parish Pastoral Council gives counsel – advice, information, and organizational and practical assistance in carrying out the three-fold mission of the Church, which is rooted in the three-fold mission of Christ, the Anointed One, given to Him by His Father: to be Priest, Prophet, and King.

Thus the Church as a whole, and each parish community, is called to pray, to teach, and to serve: prayer, worship, and liturgy (the “priestly role” of sanctification); catechesis, education and life-long formation in the Faith, and missionary outreach (the “prophetic role” of teaching); help and outreach to those in need, both within and beyond the parish boundaries (the “kingly” role of service) These are the essential elements of a parish (cluster’s) life : Worship, Word, Service, Community, Leadership, Stewardship, and Sunday Eucharist.

Parish Pastoral Council members are encouraged to learn about these elements, reflect on them in their own experience as a parishioner, and develop strategies and methods to engage the larger community in a reflection around these elements and taking responsibility for their implementation. We will seriously take the recommendations of the Pastoral Council as we are aware that they are grounded in prayer, discernment, courage, integrity and communal wisdom. All of us can look toward the future of our cluster with the hope that Parish Pastoral Councils will continue to work collaboratively with priests and parish staff members to bring greater vitality and vibrancy to parish life. To bring this hope to fruition, Fr. Brown and I will remain committed to the development of Parish Pastoral Councils, consulting with them to address the varied aspects of parish and cluster life. I also encourage you, our parishioners, to continue to step forward to lend your gifts and talents to the ongoing development of Parish Pastoral Councils and the building up of their parish communities as communities of prayer and worship, communities of faith and service.

Faith Formation

The past two weeks I've briefly shared information about our traditional classroom model and a Family home study model for Faith Formation. The last option for regular faith formation is our Monthly/Summer model for grades K-7. This model consists of 5 monthly gatherings that conclude with the summer session in August 2020. There will be options for the monthly gathering from September through May in each parish. The family chooses 5 of those to attend. After successfully attending the 5 monthly gatherings the child will be invited to attend the summer session. The Summer Session is two weeks, Monday through Friday from 8:30am to Noon at St. Hyacinth's School/Church. The summer session concludes the grade that the student was in for the 2019-2020 school year. During the summer session the students attend Mass, go to adoration, pray the rosary, are offered the sacrament of reconciliation, as well as complete course work per grade level.
