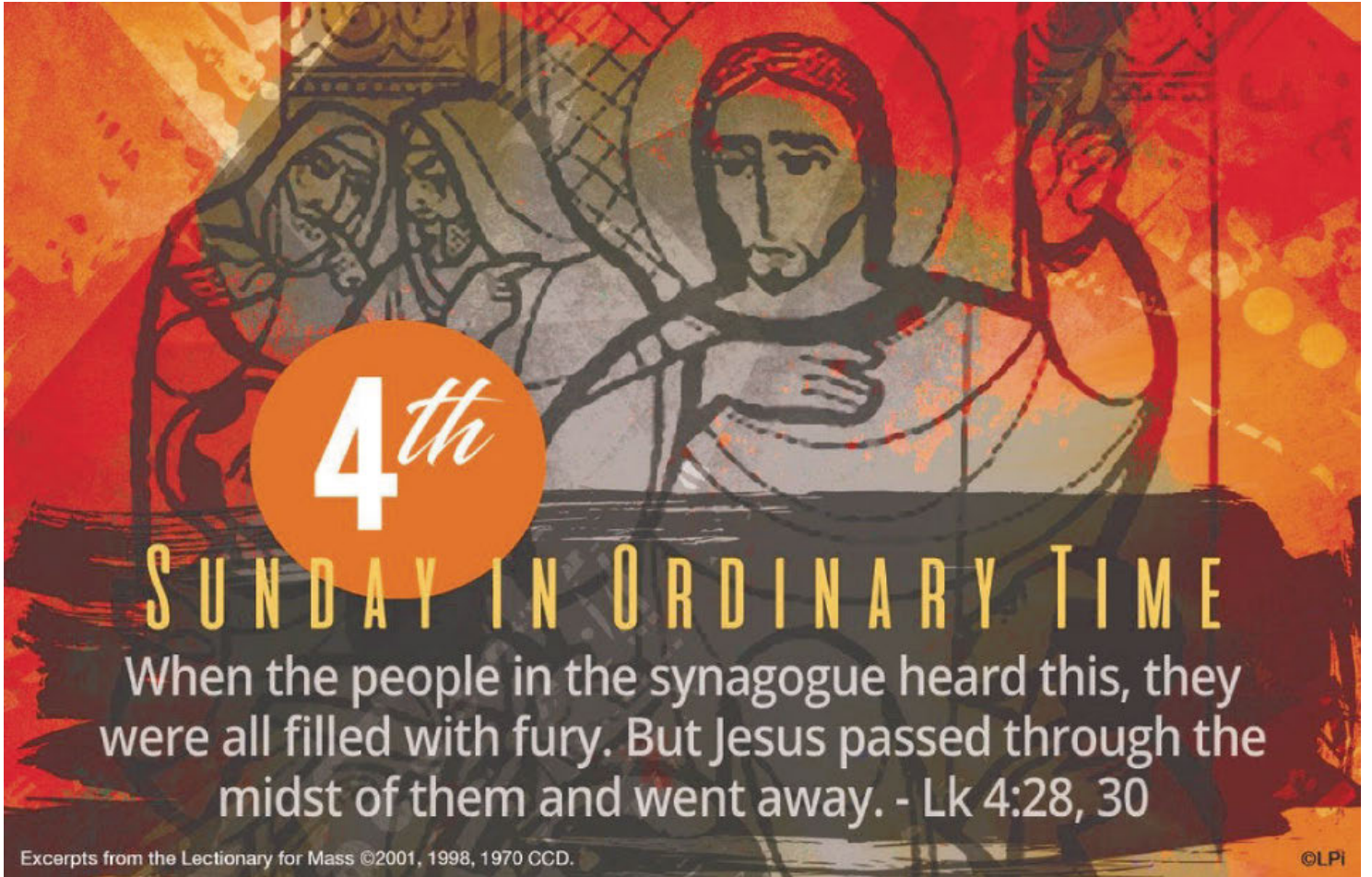

LOVE IS PATIENT, LOVE IS KIND

Among many people and places, we have over the years come across quotes and phrases that we have seen or heard in our lives, such as: “Home is where the heart is” or “An apple a day keeps the doctor away.” Since these quotes are often overused phrases, they rarely make us stop and think about their deep teaching or implications. If home is where the heart is one would wonder about those who try to escape it and if an apple a day keeps the doctor away, then what would a doctor say about those who frequent drive-through trips? Some may argue that these sayings become so instilled in us from an early age that we do not have to think about them. We know to eat an apple because a diet is better than doing our grocery shopping at a candy store. Comparatively, among my people, the Maasai of Kenya, a family will sell milk from their cow to get money for buying a bottle of Coca-Cola. Home is supposed to be a place where we feel most seen and loved and where we can find peace and comfort from an often-chaotic world.

St. Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians 13 is like the quote board of the bible on what a Christian should be. “Love is patient, love is kind” We hear it and see it so often that we forget that these word, when lived out, have the potential to change lives. It is easy to apply them during happy occasions or with people that we genuinely like being around. However, it is much more difficult to live them out in trying times or with challenging people.

Might the person you love least be at your home, is he the one who misplaced the keys for the tenth time, making everyone late for work again? The person could be the neighbor that always has passive aggressive remarks about your home, your garbage bin placement, or the way you park. It could also be the person who voted differently from you in the last major election. Even worse it could be a person staring back at you in the mirror that you cannot seem to love. God asks us to love all people regardless of who they are and to apply the same guidelines of patience and kindness to everyone, even ourselves.

We can easily downplay words of truth because they are hard to follow. Other times we dismiss them because they come from an unlikely source. In the gospel we read about Jesus speaking in the synagogue. At first, they are amazed, but then the seeds of doubt started to be sown because after all he is the son of Joseph and just a carpenter’s son. They drove him out of the town because they would rather dismiss the teachings that are difficult to live than to do the work to change. But Jesus challenges us to live a life so holy and loving that we become a walking picture of a Christian, to love in such a way that we bring Christian life and color to every place we go. We were reminded about our role in the message of last week that we are the Body of Christ, and it is as the Body of Christ that we continue Jesus’ mission. The different gifts received by the members of the Church from the Holy Spirit complement one another, and, when properly used, build up the unity of the Church and serve its mission. It is only when the Church functions effectively as the Body of Christ, when all its members are truly open to the divine Spirit and to one another, that it can be a sacrament of God’s Law of love and not love of law.
