On Our Knees Prayer and Fasting Campaign For the Dobbs Supreme Court Case

On January 22nd each year, the Catholic Church in the United States observes a *Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children* to mark the Supreme Court decision, *Roe v Wade*, on January 22, 1973, that legalized abortion throughout the United States.

In 2018, Mississippi passed a law protecting unborn children after 15 weeks of gestation. This law was challenged and the case, known as *Dobbs v Jackson's Women's Health Organization*, is awaiting a decision by the Supreme court. Oral arguments were heard on December 1, 2021 and a decision is expected in June 2022.

This is a landmark case that could potentially overturn the decision of *Roe v Wade*.

Please join the *On Our Knees* campaign in prayer and fasting for the Dobbs Supreme Court Case on the 22nd of each month, beginning on January 22, 2022, the 49th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision *Roe v Wade*, through June 22, when a decision is expected.

SAINT WHO?

Saint Joseph Vaz

Feast: January 16

Joseph was born at Benaulim, Goa (then a Portuguese colony), in India. After his ordination in 1676, he worked in Kanara and then helped to organize a house of Saint Philip Neri's Oratory for native priests who sought community life.

The island nation of Ceylon (modern Sri Lanka), then under Dutch rule, had shut out all priests for fifty years. Moved by the plight of the Catholics who were deprived of the sacraments, Joseph decided to enter the country in secret. Upon arrival, he and his companion, a former family servant, immediately contracted dysentery and were taken into the woods to die. They were saved by a woman who found them, fed them and nursed them to health.

Once recovered, Joseph took to the streets as a beggar until he was able to locate the hidden Catholics. He worked for two years ministering to these forsaken faithful, until persecution drove him to the Sinhalese Buddhist kingdom in the island's interior, where he was arrested and held by the king. When his prayers on the king's behalf brought much-needed rain, Joseph was freed and given full support in his work.

Joseph lived simply, earning the respect and support of men and women of all faiths. He died in 1711 at the age of sixty, after over twenty years in mission work. The Catholics in Sri Lanka then numbered 70,000, of whom 30,000 were converts.

Loving Father, through the intercessions of Saint Joseph Vaz, grant that I might live in such a way that my life is an invitation to those of other faiths.



FOOD FOR THE SOUL

The Miracle and Message of Cana

Today we shall ponder Jesus' first miracle, which John calls signs because Jesus doesn't perform them in order to excite wonder but to reveal the love of the Father. Initiating his public ministry at the wedding at Cana, Jesus reveals himself as the spouse of the People of God and reveals to us the depth of the relationship that unites us to him: it is the new covenant of love. What is at the foundation of our faith? An act of mercy by which Jesus binds us to him. And the Christian life is the response to this love, it is like the history of two people in love, God and man meet, seek, find, celebrate and love one another: just like the lovers in the Song of Songs. Everything else comes as a result of this relationship. The Church is the family of Jesus into which he pours his love: it is this love that the Church safeguards and desires to give to all. In the context of the covenant we are also to understand our Lady's observation: *they have no wine*. How can one celebrate a wedding feast and make merry without what the prophets indicated as typical element of the messianic banquet? Water is necessary for life, but wine expresses the abundance of a banquet and the joy of a feast. This wedding feast was short of wine; the newlyweds are ashamed of this. Just imagine ending a wedding feast drinking tea. Wine is necessary for a feast. By transforming into wine the water of the jars used for the Jewish rites of purification, Jesus performs an eloquent sign: he transforms the Law of Moses into Gospel, bearer of joy.

The words Mary addresses to the servants come to crown the wedding of Cana: *Do whatever he tells you*. These are her last words recounted by the Gospels; they are the legacy she hands down to us. Today too our Lady says to us all: "Whatever Jesus tells you, do it." At this wedding the new covenant is truly articulated and to the servants of the Lord, that is to all the Church, is entrusted a new mission: *Do whatever he tells you!* To serve the Lord means to listen and to put into practice his Word. For each one of us, to draw from the jar is equivalent to entrusting oneself to the Word of God in order to experience its effectiveness in life. Thus, together with the steward who tasted the water-become-wine, we too can exclaim: you *have kept the good wine until now*. Yes, the Lord continues to reserve the best wine for our salvation, just as it continues to flow from the pierced side of the Lord.

The wedding feast at Cana is more than a simple account of Jesus' first miracle. Like a treasure chest, he guards the secret of his Person and the purpose of his coming: the awaited Groom starts off the wedding that is fulfilled in the Paschal Mystery. At this wedding Jesus binds his disciples to himself in a new and final covenant. At Cana the faith of the Church is born. We are all invited to the wedding feast because the new wine will never run short!

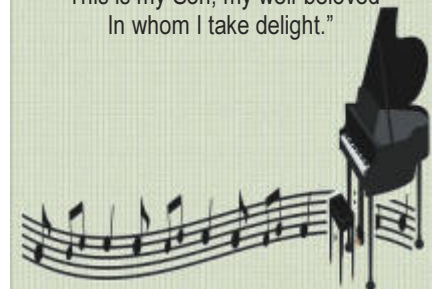


SING TO THE LORD

World Marriage Day Mass with Bishop Lucia, February 13, 2022, 2pm.

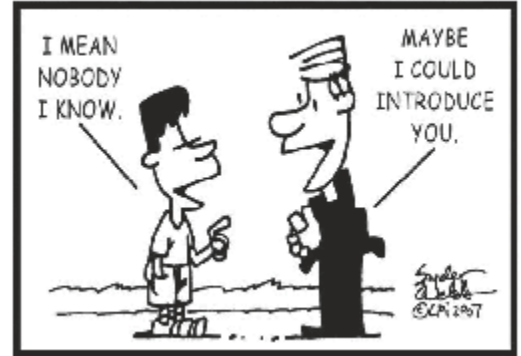
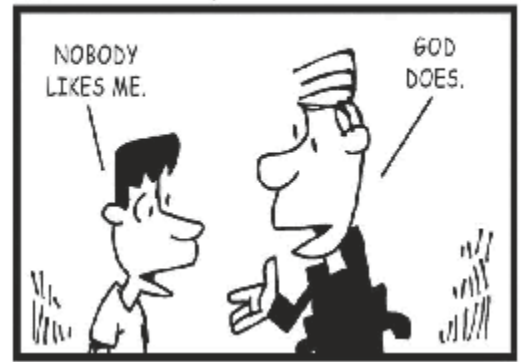
