# SAINT WHO??

Blessed Braulio Maria Corres and 69 Companions Feast Day: July 30

During the Spanish Civil War of 1936-1939 and especially in the early months of the conflict, individual clergymen were executed while entire religious communities were persecuted, leading to a death toll of 13 bishops, 4,172 diocesan priests and seminarians, 2,364 monks and friars and 283 nuns, for a total of 6,832 clerical victims, as part of what is referred to as Spain's Red Terror.

A member of the order of Saint John of God, Braulio Corres lived in Spain during the Spanish Civil War, a conflict that has been called a "rehearsal for World War II." The order had a charism of serving in hospitals, with special dedication to the mentally ill. (Their founder, Saint John of God, had for a time been treated as a lunatic.) Father Corres was the master of novices for the brothers who ran a hospital in Tarragona.

When civil war broke out, many Catholics were tortured and killed for refusing to blaspheme and even for participating in works of charity. The brothers were offered the opportunity to return to their families, but they chose instead to honor their vows, remaining at the sides of the mentally handicapped and the hospitalized children whom they served. Father Corres, aged thirty-nine, began to prepare his novices for martyrdom.

The Communist party took over the hospital and removed all signs of religion. The brothers continued to work and increased their time of prayer. They were mocked, tempted and finally sent out to their deaths. As they went, Father Corres gave his brothers absolution, encouraging them to forgive their enemies. He died on July 30, 1936.

#### FOOD FOR THE SOUL St John Henry Newman "Singing, In Darkness" Part II

The engineer saw a sudden cloud of coal dust coming up from below. "I stood on the edge of the pit," he said. "I heard a roar and saw a red flame right down the shaft." As the roar grew louder he cried out to the men nearby to get away. Suddenly a great red ball of fire heaved up from the shaft, followed by a black cloud so thick, for a while he lay flat on the ground, half conscious and could see nothing. He could hardly breathe, but "the air in the shaft reversed and carried the remainder of the black with it," back into the chasm, where men were working, 800 feet below.

The day was February 16, 1909 and the place was West Stanley, in the rich coal fields of County Durham, in the north of England—not a place of wealth or high culture. Shortly before that cloud of dust, a couple of fuses blew in the generator room, but still no one knows what caused the explosion in the mine below. Men died almost instantly from the gases. Of the 168 miners lost to suffocation and poisoning, at least 48 were mere boys. But a small group of miners had been saved by a pocket of clear air, where the cloud had not gone.

They were in total darkness. Then one of the men began to hum *Lead, Kindly Light,* and the rest joined in, singing the words they knew by heart. They had a long wait ahead. It was the middle of the night before any rescue could be attempted, nor did anyone know exactly how many miners were down there. But the hymn consoled them. We are not talking about mere feelings here. They believed every word that Newman wrote. We place ourselves in the hands of God. Let him lead us, each step. The future is his, not ours, to determine.

Twenty-six men in that seam were brought out alive.




