

R ev. John J. Heagerty August 18, 2023

Rev. John J. Heagerty, 96, of Syracuse, passed away August 18, 2023.

He was a graduate of North High School and received his Bachelor's degree from St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry in Rochester in 1954. He was ordained on February 2, 1954 at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Syracuse. He completed his Master's degree from Syracuse University in 1963.

He served as an assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church in Skaneateles and Blessed Sacrament Church

before joining the faculty at Bishop Ludden High School and serving as Principal from 1963-70. He then became Pastor at St. Patrick's Church, Chittenango, St. John the Evangelist, Syracuse, St. Paul Catholic Church, Binghamton and St. Matthew's Church, East Syracuse where he served for 21 years before retiring in 1997.

After retirement he served Mass for St. Joseph the Worker in Liverpool and St. Mary's Church and St. Anthony's Church both in Cortland. His last ministry was serving the spiritual needs of the all the people living at the Nottingham where he resided for the past 10 plus years. He was also an avid golfer and was a member at Arrowhead Golf Course where he played right up to July of this year. He is survived by several cousins including, Nancy Hollenbeck O'Neill, Mary Hollenbeck and John J. Heagerty.





Josephine Dudzik was born on August 30, 1860, in a village in Poland called Plocicz. When she was 21, she immigrated with her family to Chicago to seek a better life. Josephine was interested in her faith and spiritual life, so she joined the Third Order Secular of St. Francis at her family's parish with a friend. During this time, Chicago was experiencing a long depression along with the rest of the region. Faced with poverty all around her, she began doing what she could to care for impoverished people, even bringing them into her home.

As she cared for the poor, her vision of what could be possible when it came to her service to those in need grew. She consulted with the pastor of her parish about organizing women at the parish to help her in her endeavors and about the possibility of even purchasing a larger home specifically to care for the poor in their community. He agreed to support her dream with one condition — that she and the other women involved start a religious congregation. She agreed and, along with other women from the Third Order Secular of St. Francis, established the Franciscan Sisters of the Blessed Kunegunda. They named the congregation for the soon-to-becanonized Blessed Kunegunda from Poland whose cause for canonization was popular with the local Polish population in Chicago. Her new order officially began in December 1894, and was the first order of religious women founded within Chicago city limits.

In 1900, Theresa and four of her friends took their profession of vows. She took the name Mary Theresa and led the congregation as their superior for ten years. During this time Sister Theresa started and operated the St. Joseph's Home for the Aged and Crippled, St. Vincent's Orphanage, and worked to build a daycare and institutions of education. They served the poorest of the poor and she quickly became known locally as Chicago's Apostle of Mercy.

After 10 years as the congregation's superior, she was removed due to a nasty rumor that she was mismanaging the mission's funding. She obediently took on more menial tasks in the congregation without complaint and continued to serve in whatever role she was given —unwavering in her service to the people of Chicago alongside her sisters. Her best friend, Sister Wysinski, was made superior instead and they continued their work together that way, expanding the congregation together to 160 women by the late 1910's!

In 1918, Sr. Theresa contracted cancer and on September 20 of the same year she passed away.

Posthumously, she was given the title of Mother in recognition of her role as the foundress of what is now called the Franciscan Sisters of Chicago. In 1994, Saint Pope John Paul II gave Mother Mary Theresa Dudzik the title of Venerable. *Prayer*



Choosing the Cross

I've been called a lot of things in my life, but I've never been called "Satan," at least not to my face.

It seems to me the worst name you could call a person, and today we hear it straight from the lips of Jesus. It's just one of the many small reminders strewn throughout Scripture that Jesus preaches meekness, but he is not mild — not when mildness serves no purpose, anyway.

And here, when Peter is trying to deter Jesus from making the right choice, mildness serves no purpose at all.

Can we blame Peter? I certainly can't. I'm sure I would have said the same thing to my own dear friend. He is, in today's Gospel, wholly unwilling to embrace the cross — he's afraid of it, even — but aren't we all, in the end, afraid of our cross? I am. It's no sin, it's only human. Fear is natural. Self-preservation is a reflex.

What Christ speaks of today is a choice, one we are all faced with, again and again, just as Peter is. We will not always respond perfectly; Peter does not respond well today. He does not respond well on Holy Thursday.

But on his last day, on the day of the ultimate choice? On that day, he chooses the cross.

We marvel at first responders who put themselves in harm's way for the sake of others, because to do so is not human, it is divine. I have to believe that if even a firefighter's loved one threw themselves in his way, he would still charge toward the flames, crying, "Get behind me."

Christ runs into the burning building for us, shaking off not only his own fear (and he had it, I promise you — he was human, too) but the fear of everyone who loved him.




