



#### **Saint Toribio Romo**

Feast Day: May 21

# Saint WHO ??

St. Toribio Romo González (1900 – 1928) was born in Santa Ana de Guadalupe, near Jalisco, Mexico. He entered seminary at the age of 13 and was ordained a priest in 1922 when he was only 22. As a priest, he dedicated himself to serving the faithful in the midst of the Cristero War, a period of intense religious persecution in Mexico during the 1920s and 1930s.

Despite the danger posed by the anti-Catholic government, Romo continued to carry out his pastoral duties. He provided sacraments, offered spiritual guidance, promoted devotion to the Eucharist, and was frequently forced more and more to do so in secret or under the cover of night. He became known for

his compassion and selflessness, often risking his own safety to bring consolation and hope to the persecuted Catholic community, and catechesis, as well as the Eucharist, to the poor.

In the late 1920's, a formal law was passed that imposed strict penalties on priests who were found exercising their priestly ministries. Despite the risks, Romo continued to celebrate Mass and administer the sacraments to those in remote areas. For a time, he had to hide in an abandoned distillery in the town of Tequila in order to avoid violence, and celebrated Mass there for the community.

Tragically, on February 25, 1928, Romo was murdered. He was shot twice by government troops who broke into his bedroom while he was asleep. His martyrdom became a powerful testimony to the enduring strength of the Catholic Church in Mexico in the face of discrimination. St. Toribio Romo, pray for us!

## OUR STAINED GLASS WINDOWS ~ Saint Jerome Donated by the Altar Boys Location: Over Mary's Altar— Saint Matthew's

Born to well off parents in Stridon, near Aquileia (in modern Italy), Jerome was a scholar of both Latin and Greek and a master of rhetoric. After studies in Rome, he had conversion experience and eventually he decided to become a monk with some friends in Aquileia. When tensions rose, he left and found his way to the forbidding desert southeast of Antioch (modern Turkey). He later wrote, "In this exile and prison, to which, in fear of hell, I had voluntarily condemned myself, with no other company but scorpions and wild beasts, I frequently imagined I could see young Roman women dancing and it was as if I was there in the midst of them.... In my cold body and my parched flesh, which seemed dead before its time, passion was able to live." No penitential regimen would ward off the temptations, but when Jerome began to study Hebrew, tutored by a monk who was a Jewish convert, he found some relief.

After further studies in Constantinople under Saint Gregory Nazianzen, Jerome went to Rome, where Pope Damasus I tapped him as his secretary and he began the monumental task of completing a Latin translation of the Bible.

In his later years, Jerome moved to a cave in the Holy Land, founded a monastery and continued his work translating and commenting on the Scriptures. He died in Bethlehem.

Holy Week is a week for being mindful. We must set loose the baggage of Lent, and not be deterred by the dazzling sunrise of Easter morning beckoning in the distance.

It's okay for us to be excited for Easter. We've waited so long, after all. In my opinion it's one of the best feelings there is: the yearning we have in our hearts for the Resurrection as we embark on Palm Sunday. And in a purely logical sense, many of us have Easter celebrations for which we are preparing, and practical considerations to contend with. It's going to be a busy week, one likely full of happy distractions.

But my friends, we simply must keep our feet on the ground. Let's not "skip" Holy Week. Resist the urge to flip to the last page of the book, to fast-forward to the final scene of the movie. Don't rob yourself of the journey. This week is a blessed opportunity. It is this week that teaches us who we are. In the span of the Triduum, we have the birthday of the priesthood, the institution of the Eucharist, the sacrifice on Calvary and so many other vivid and meaningful scenes.

It may sound strange, to advise someone to savor the moments of Holy Week. There are so many violent and heartrending moments, after all. But this is the valley of tears, remember — we are not in Heaven yet. And here, in our fallen, sin-filled world, it is the heartrending moments that seem to matter the most.

These are the moments that define us as Catholics. Live them. Cherish them. Be present for each one.
