Stewardship Thoughts



Dear Friends

Dear Friends,

How is your prayer life? No, really? You don't need to answer out loud and you don't need to give the answer that you think a "good Catholic" should give, just ask yourself that question. This is an essential question to ask ourselves as Catholic Christians, daily. Without prayer, we truly don't have a relationship with God our Father and His Son, Christ. Mother Teresa said, "Prayer is the only channel through which God's great graces and favors may flow into the soul; and if this be once closed, I know no other way He can communicate them."

As we continue this journey through Ordinary time, we should take this time to strengthen the essentials we will need to live our faith. Some could make an argument that prayer life is easier during the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. When our environments encourage us to pray. It can also be said accurately, that when tragedy besets us, our family, our world, heaven is inundated with prayers. Both of these are good and should occur, but like any great and loving relationship with someone, you don't want to just spend time with them at the holidays or during bad times. That relationship needs time during those normal, run of the mill, "Ordinary", green days. St. John Chrysostom said, "Prayer is the place of refuge for every worry, a foundation for cheerfulness, a source of constant happiness, a protection against sadness."

In addition to disciplining ourselves with making time in our day for this relationship, we Catholics have a unique problem – 2000 years of beautiful prayer resources. It is like walking into the biggest library you can think of, full of the greatest books ever written, and trying to decide what to read. It would be overwhelming! This is our Church's prayer library. Do you pray the Rosary? Do you use the prayers of your childhood? Do you just meditate and listen to our Lord? Do you say a novena? Do you read Sacred Scripture – which part, the Gospels or the Psalms? We would suggest that you don't try to do it all, don't even try to do half of it. Pick 1, 2, or 3 ways for prayer and just try them. Do they help you grow in your relationship with Jesus and his Father? If yes, stay with them. If not, try something else from the "library." Maybe a morning audio rosary in the car on your way to work, a lunch-time daily reading, or an evening just listening to God. Perhaps, it's 5 minutes of complete silence asking Jesus to be with you that day and listening to him, or a Hail Mary and Our Father while you are waiting for your order at lunch, and Family evening prayer. HE just wants the time with US and WE NEED the time with HIM.

It should be, in a loving relationship that the Father and His Son want to have with us. However, do not underestimate the power of prayer being observed at times. Seeing a person cross themselves and say a silent 5 second prayer before they take their first bite of food. Seeing a person moving their fingers around a set of beads. These are moments of evangelization. Just as important if not more so, is a child seeing his mother and or father in times of prayer. We are their greatest Catechists, parents, children will imitate what they see.

God the Father loves us. Jesus our Savior loves us. They want time with us. They will come to our invitation of prayer. Will we make the time and send that invitation?


