## Medicare Open Enrollment October 15-December 7th

## PLEASE BE ADVISED:

For the period October 15 - December 7 SHINE counselors are not able to provide one-on-one appointments
to discuss your Part D plans - there are not enough appointment hours available.

Please consider attending this very important presentation below discussing the plan changes for 2023 plans.


Wednesday, October 5th 1:00PM

SHINE Counselors - will present an overview of upcoming Medicare changes to Part D prescription plans. A Q \& A period following the presentation, but will not allow for detailed discussions or review of individual medical conditions.

During open enrollment you should review your options for the coming year and, if need be, enroll in a new Part D plan. You want to make sure that you'll be enrolled in the most cost effective plan for next year.

If you are enrolled in a Medicare Part D drug plan, you should receive in the mail an information packet from your plan by the end of September. It is important to read and save this information because it explains the changes to premiums, deductibles, co-pays, and drugs covered.

Pre-enrollment forms and instructions will be available for pick up at the reception desk starting Friday, September 30. You can bring these
completed forms back with you when you attend this presentation. You can also bring your list of meds with you and fill out the SHINE pre-enrollment form while you are here at the presentation. Make sure that you include your Medicare Account User Name and Password when you fill out the form. If you do not have a Medicare account, SHINE will assign a user name, password and hint question.

If you do not provide Medicare account information or allow SHINE to create an account, no Part D search will be conducted and this form will be returned to you.

Completed forms can also be returned to Weymouth Elder Services in person by mail, or by using the drop box outside of the senior center. Mark your sealed envelope ATTN: SHINE.

Once completed, search results will be mailed to you with instructions on how to enroll in the best Part D plan for next year.

Old North Church
Unbeknownst to many, the Old North Church basement houses a crypt containing approximately 1,100 burials. From 1732 to 1860 the church interred congregants below its very floor boards as a way to meet the burial demands of the congregation while also taking advantage of all available space on the property. Join us for a guided tour of the basement Crypt and discover the macabre history of colonial death practices. Note: Participants should be comfortable in a basement setting and navigating tight spaces. The crypt has low lighting, uneven surfaces, and is not wheelchair accessible. Walkers WILL fit in the crypt. Buses depart senior center at 9:30 AM for our 10:30 AM reservation, finishing at about 11:45 AM. Then we'll head to Theo's Cozy Corner Café for lunch before returning to the senior center. 20 seats are available. Registration costs $\$ 20$ per person and includes ticket for crypt tour. Be sure to bring lunch money! Refund is available ONLY if we find a replacement for you.

1．Get a copy of your Mass driver＇s license showing your residency／age
2．Provide a contact phone number or email when registering
3．Send $\$ 10.00$ to cover the cost
4．Mail your Senior Parking Pass with the following info：

## SNAP ASSISTANCE

Many of you are aware that the Department of Transitional Assistance （DTA）is warning clients of skimming scams that have impacted some DTA clients．As a result the DTA strongly recommends that you change your PIN and change it on a regular basis to prevent any future scams．

How to change a PIN：
1．Call 800－997－2555
2．Choose your language
3．Enter the number on the front of your card
4．Press 2 to PIN your EBT card
5．When asked for last 4 of your SSN， enter them．If you do not have an SSN， enter the last 4 digits of your 99 number assigned to you by DTA．If you do not know this 99 number，call the
DTA Assistance Line at 877－382－2363
6．Enter your Date of Birth（month／day／ year -2 digits for month， 2 digits for day， and 4 digits for year）．For example， 1201 1989 for December 1， 1989
7．Enter your NEW 4－digit PIN；then enter it again．Choose a different PIN from any previous PINs．

## Assisted Living Resources

WHITECANE AWARENESS
White Cane Awareness Day is October 15．All states and many other countries have White Cane laws，which allow pedestrians，who are legally blind，the right of way at street crossings．Most people who are legally blind have some usable vision．Massachusetts White Cane Law states that All motorists， when they see a pedestrian who uses a dog guide or a white cane at a street crossing，must come to a complete stop． When in doubt always stop and be safe．

## Affordable Connectivity Program

 Are you aware of the Affordable Connectivity Program（ACP）？The ACP is run by the Federal Communications Commission（FCC）．This is a program to help low－income households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet．You may be eligible if you，or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP，Medicaid，SSI，WIC，Pell Grant，or Free and Reduced－Price Lunch．
## The ACP provides the following：

－Up to a $\$ 30 /$ month discount on your internet service
－A one－time discount of up to $\$ 100$ for a laptop，tablet，or desktop computer（with a co－payment of more than $\$ 10$ but less than $\$ 50$ ）

## Medicare Enrollment－First Time

 Most people first become eligible for Medicare when they turn 65．To have coverage begin the month of your 65th birthday，you must enroll during the three months prior to your birthday．Your Initial Enrollment Period（IEP）extends three months past your birthday month， but your effective date will be later．If you don＇t enroll during your IEP，you may have a lifetime penalty．For further assistance about this or any Medicare issue，please contact the SHINE Program． To schedule a SHINE appointment，call the Council on Aging at 781－682－6140．
