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NEWS & EVENTS



Last October Wilbraham residents approved the funds for building a new senior center on land behind Town Hall. The committee charged with assuring that the structure is built got to work immediately. This article summarizes important actions taken to move the project forward, control costs to meet the budget, and pursue solutions to issues which could potentially cause delays.

To expedite the multi-faceted process, the committee recommended that the town hire John Catlin as architect. Because of his decades of success designing and building over 55 senior centers, he was hired to develop initial plans prior to the town vote His experience and sound advice to Wilbraham were key to officially offering him the role of architect for the project.

The next step was to hire an Owner's Project Manager (OPM), a function required for municipal projects of this size. After interviewing three firms, P3 Project Planning Specialists was hired. Their contribution to date has been most helpful and we expect that to continue.

The most difficult aspect of developing the detailed plans and drawings, which are extensive, has been to adjust the design and materials so that the original concept could be built. The significant supply-chain and inflation issues that have hit all aspects of our lives, and especially construction materials, are responsible for the serious constraints on the original budget. To accomplish this, Catlin's design and estimating team made cost-saving changes to the design and evaluated alternative materials to achieve optimal results. What has not changed are the size of the building (approximately15,400 sq. ft.), conceptual space usage and use of materials that offer optimal structural and long-term maintenance benefits.

A significant savings for both construction and future maintenance is the planned extension of the town's sewer system from Town Hall to the Stony Hill School hookup access point. This extension will be paid for through separate funds the town is receiving from the state. For the Senior Center, this project reduces costs because sewer access will be a tie-in to the town's new lines; and the Center's initially planned new septic system will now not have to be built. Important savings for the Town will be achieved because the Town Hall's aging septic system will not have to be replaced or maintained.

The next step in the building schedule is to send a request for bids to contractors by mid-August. Keeping on schedule is in the best interest of everyone in controlling costs and bringing the Center into fruition.

Finally, if the bids do not come in at or below the project's budgeted funds, a likely alternative will be to call a town meeting to shore up the difference. Construction cannot commence unless a project's full costs are allocated. Once the bids are received, the town has 30 days to award the contract and that is the period in which the final funding must be decided. The October 2021 cost estimate presented at the town meeting already accounted for supply-chain aggravated cost increases. Since that time, inflation has increased material costs even more than anticipated. Some prices have come down in the past two months. The need for project fund adjustment will not be fully known until the bids are in by mid to late September.

I am happy to announce that the Social Service Office has been approved to be a part of the SNAP Outreach Program partnering with the Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) and the University of Massachusetts Medical School (UMMS). If you are a SNAP Participant or considering in applying for SNAP, this allows me to process new applications and recertify existing SNAP applicants directly to DTA.

Farmer's Market Coupons 2022

Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program Coupons are here.

To be eligible to receive Senior Farmers Market Coupons, you must be:

• 60 years of age or older, or

Disabled and living in senior housing where congregate nutrition services are provided

Your income must be lower than the Income Limits outlined below. To be eligible to receive Senior Farmers Market Coupons, an applicant's gross household income (i.e. before taxes are withheld) must be no more than:

Household Size Monthly
1 \$2,096
2 \$2.823

If you qualify to receive coupons please call and you will be put on a list. Names will be put in a drawing and be distributed in July. 596-8379

KNOX BOX PROGRAM

The Wilbraham Senior Center, in conjunction with the Wilbraham Fire Department, sponsors a Knox Box program for seniors in town. The box hangs on the outside of the front door and holds a spare key that the Fire Department can use to enter the home in case of emergency. The Fire Department is the only department authorized and capable to unlock the box to retrieve the spare key.

Residential Lockbox Criteria*

1.Individual has been identified as having multiple conditions: obvious physical frailty (e.g. problems w/mobility and/or balance, history of falls), existence of other health problems, lives alone, prior emergency calls.

2. Individual has/needs Personal Emergency Response System.

Annual donation of \$12.00 for the lease of a Knox Box. Fee may be waived by the Senior Center if there is financial hardship. Questions/ concerns please call Barbara Harrington at 413 596-8379.

Fuel Assistance 2022-2023 Heating Season

Annual Gross Income

Eligibility

Applicants must reside in Hampden County (except Springfield)

Household income cannot exceed 60% of the Estimated State Median Income

Those who have heat included in their rent and meet income and residence eligibility may be eligible to receive a subsidy for a portion of their monthly income from November to April

Those who have heat included in their rent and have a subsidy must pay over 30% of their income towards rent in order to be eligible

Those who live in public housing are not eligible (are already state or federally aided)

The heating season is right around the corner and I am sure that paying for heating costs have been on the minds of many of you. The price of fuel has risen substantially; everyone is feeling the crunch in a world where everything suddenly costs more.

Fuel Assistance helps eligible households challenged by the high cost of home heating fuel. Valley Opporutnity Council (Fuel Assistance) pays a portion of their winter heating bills. If you fall in the income guideline call Barbara for more information.

Open Enrollment for Medicare

To all Medicare beneficiaries, Open Enrollment for Medicare is just around the corner,October15-December 7,2022. This is your opportunity to make changes to your Medicare plans for the year 2023. Our staff will be booking in-person appointments with our SHINE representative on Thursday afternoons and Fridays during Open Enrollment to assist you. Please take note of the following guidelines to make your appointment as smooth as possible;

- 1) you must already be enrolled in Medicare A and B to schedule an Open Enrollment appointment
- 2) you will need your Medicare card as well as all other health insurance and prescription drug cards
- 3) you must have your most recent Prescription drug list with accurate name of the drug, dosage and frequency with which you are taking the medication
- 4) please check with your providers ahead of time to verify which Medicare plans they accept
- 5)if you use a computer we recommend setting up a <u>Medicare.gov</u> account BEFORE your SHINE appointment.
- Go too www.medicare.gov and select Log-In/ Create an Account to get started
- 6)if you already have a <u>Medicare.gov</u> account please bring your user name and password to your appointment. Use the retrieval tool on Medicare .gov if you have forgotten your user name and/or password
- 7)if you need to cancel your appointment please call 48 hours ahead of time so we can fit someone else into your time slot.

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
