

### KITCHEN KORNER

Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Cookies



- 1 1/2 cups Packed Brown Sugar
- 1 Cup Butter or margarine softened
- 1 tsp Vanilla extract
- 1 Large Egg
- 2 Cups Quick-cooking oats
- 1 1/2 Cups All Purpose Flour
- 1 tsp Baking Soda
- 1 Cup Semisweet Chocolate Chips



In a large bowl, mix brown sugar and butter until blended. Beat in vanilla and egg until light and fluffy. Mix in oats, flour and baking soda; stir in chocolate chips.

Drop tablespoonfuls of dough onto ungreased cookie sheet about 2 inches apart.

Bake 9 to11 minutes or until golden brown. Cool slightly and remove from cookie sheet to wire rack. Once cookies are cooled, store in an airtight container.



### The Way It Was

I have fond memories of the town I was born and raised in. It is a mountainous region in the Poconos area. There was a diverse multi-immigrant population that came to America at the turn of the century for a better life. They were hard working and self sufficient. Government Assistance was unheard of at that time.

Children played outdoors without worry and doors were never locked. Family and friends would stop in at any time of the day. Women stayed at home to care for their families.

Cars were scarce so farmers, butchers, and bakers brought their products to your door. It was delightful to have the pick of your favorite apple, and purchase a basket, and so it was with the other merchants.

Occasionally an old ragman came around with a dilapidated horse and wagon. He would collect old clothes and discard rags for two cents a pound. The children would collect the pennies and dash to the neighborhood candy store for their favorite candy.

Children walked to school, home for lunch, and back to school again in every kind of weather. When mother baked bread, we were sure to have pizza for lunch, our favorite.

Oh, how I liked to reminisce about the beautiful music my uncle and his friends play for our family on any given Sunday. Afterwards, we would all sit down to a delicious dinner prepared by mother.

On the outskirts of town secluded in a wooded area was a spring lake called "Honey Hole" where young men went skinny-dipping on hot summer days. I'm sure the girls would have enjoyed that refreshing water but obviously they wouldn't dare.


After World War II, when the veterans returned home, there weren't many jobs to be had, so many men left town to seek employment elsewhere. The steel mill was booming, as was the building of Levittown and Fairless Hills. It was convenient for many men to choose to work there, and they did.

In time Hazleton changed completely, it is now a different culture, but I still like to remember the way it was.
