A LITTLE HISTORY OF THE VALENTINE CARD

Today, Valentine's Day is celebrated in Canada, Mexico, the United Kingdom, France, Australia and the United States, although it's most common in the U.K. and the U.S. Americans likely began exchanging handmade cards in the early 1700s, but a woman named Esther A. Howland really changed the game in 1840 when she began selling the first mass-produced cards in the country. Known as the "Mother of the Valentine," she created elaborate pieces of art that had real lace, ribbons and colorful pictures known as "scrap."

We've got Howland to thank for the explosion of cards' popularity, ever since. Today, according to the <u>Greeting Card Association</u>, we send an estimated 145 million Valentine's Day cards each year, not counting the ones kids pass out in their classrooms. Women purchase approximately 85 percent of all valentines. So when you send your valentines this year, know you're participating in an age-old tradition – and not just a commercial one.

For other supplemental food sources, **Senior Distribution Day** at the Wachusett Food Pantry, located at 50 Worcester Road in Sterling, is the third Friday of the month: Friday, February 21 from 9AM – 11AM. In addition, the Outreach Office can assist with SNAP (food stamps) applications. If you need help stretching your food budget this winter, please contact Karen at 508-886-7945, ext. 2 for information and assistance.

As a reminder, we use MySeniorCenter key tag swipes to keep track of attendance. If you do not have a tag, please stop by the Outreach Office to obtain one. Thank you!

We will continue to offer Caregiver Support Group Meetings twice weekly in 2022 – (Tuesdays at 1:00 pm and Fridays at 10:00 am). Please call 508-886-7945, ext. 2 to reserve your spot.

COMMUNITY NEWS AND MORE



Chair caning history goes way back. The craft of chair seat weaving and chair caning. in particular, has been practiced for centuries and is still a viable craft today, experienced all over the world. Similar cane or "wicker" weaves date back as far as Egyptian times with artifacts such as a woven daybed discovered that once belonged to King Tutankhamen, (1325 B. C.). Chair

seat weaving, and especially chair caning was practiced in South East Asia, Portugal, France, and England in the mid-1600s, becoming very popular and extensively used through the 1700-1800s and on into the early 1900s.

The techniques and materials have not changed much in all the years and only a few common tools are necessary to repair chair seats, making chair caning a craft that nearly anyone can master with just a little patience and tenacity. Chair cane (the outer skin or bark of the rattan palm) is used primarily in weaving antique and modern chair seats. However, it's also used extensively as wrappings on rattan furniture and is sometimes used to weave entire sets of new or reproduction wicker furniture. The strands of cane used in **chair seat weaving** is the shiny, glossy skin or inner bark from the stem or trunk of the rattan palm, genus Calamus Rotan. There are hundreds of species, but only a few are suited to produce the high quality needed for chair seat weaving.

Hole-to-hole or 7-Step Method of Hand Chair Caning, which is weaving individual strips through a series of drilled holes around the perimeter of the chair seat frame. The result ends in an octagon shape pattern throughout the seat. Hole-to-Hole traditional hand caning is the method used in this class; however, some of the students have researched other methods needed for projects and with assistance from the instructors, have been able to recreate the piece. Wide binding cane stool woven in twill Source: The Wicker Woman pattern is an example of this.
