# Stay connected with the SOUTHAMPTON COUNCIL ON AGING February 2022

#### **SENIORS!**

Are you aware of the Real Estate exemptions the Town of Southampton offers to Seniors?

Eligibility for the exemptions offered under Mass Law Chapter 59, Section 5 is based on specific factors, some of which are income, age, disability status, and veteran status. The assessors' office administers tax exemptions and can provide information on how to apply for them. If you are a member of one of the populations below, please contact the assessors' office (see contact info below) for more information on how to apply for the following tax exemptions:

- **Persons over the age of 65** (Clause 41C see chart below)
- Persons 70 years or older, or a surviving spouse, or a minor child of deceased parents (Clause 17D see chart below)

**Veterans or surviving spouses** – a wide range of exemptions are available. Please see the assessors' page on the town website or the **Commonwealth of MA website** for more information on the variety of veterans' exemptions. (some are listed below)

- **Blind Persons** you may qualify for a \$500 property tax exemption.
- Surviving Spouses of firefighters or police officers you may qualify for a total property tax exemption. Persons experiencing severe hardship due to age, infirmity, & poverty

#### Veterans

<u>VETERANS</u> with a service-connected disability of 10% or more, who meet residency, domicile and ownership requirements may be eligible for an exemption benefit. This is a partial list & also includes benefits to spouses and surviving spouses of those veterans.

Clause	Exemption Amount	Ellegibility
22	\$400	Veterans with a service connected disability of 10% or more
22C	\$1,500	Veterans who suffered total disability in line of duty & requires specially adopted housing
22E	\$1,000	Veterans who have a service-connected disability of 100%



for Fuel Assistance. The guidelines are as follows: Family size—Yearly Income

(1) - \$40,951 (2) \$53,551 (3) - \$54,925 (4) - \$66,151

You must bring the following items in order to complete your application:

- -Valid Picture ID for the Head of Household.
- -Names, birthdates and Social Security Numbers for all household members.

All members are required to sign the application.

- -Proof of income for the past 30 days for all household members.
- -If you are a homeowner, real estate tax bill, homeowner's insurance, and mortgage.
- -If you are a renter, copy of lease. An Electric bill and heating company name and account number.
