

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS WITH RETIRED OFFICER HANSHAW



The month of September is well known for a number of happenings as we slowly approach the end of summer. As temperatures begin to cool, the sunset arrives earlier in the evening and apples become ready for picking; children will return to the classrooms. The annual start of a new school year is always a big event and an important time to talk about safety, even when you don't have a child boarding the school bus. There are many ways kids travel to

school and motorists need to be watchful for pedestrians, school buses and especially bicycles. Quite often young people will be distracted by the excitement, so please be careful when sharing the road.

The long-awaited completion of the Elm Street project is nearly here but crews still have plenty of small tasks to handle. Drivers are asked to be watchful for construction crews as work will continue through the late fall in the area. The new pavement, sidewalks, road markings and traffic signals are great compliments to neighborhood and should improve the traffic flow and safety between downtown and Rte. 110. You may have noticed the addition of bicycle lanes on both sides of the street, which are clearly marked. These paths are meant to improve safety for riders, please stay within the marked travel lane and avoid using the bike lane for parking or passing. Drivers who are going 25 mph should have no difficulty staying within the newly marked lanes, which are set to State standards. The landscape of Elm Street is much different than three years ago but this change is certainly for the better.





Fuel assistance season runs from November 1st through April 30th and is available for eligible homeowners and renters, including households whose cost of heat is included in the rent (12 month assistance in that case). It pays directly to your primary heating source vendor, and automatically includes electric and telephone bill discounts if you are eligible, saving you money to use for medical or other expenses.

If you feel moving to an Assisted Living facility might be somewhere in your future, maybe within the next five years. You may want to learn about a VA benefit that is applicable to wartime veterans and their surviving spouses that will assist you with the costs of an Assisted Living facility. The term wartime veteran applies to any veteran who served during a wartime period; the veteran does not have to have served in combat. There are additional criteria that apply before getting this benefit and the Veteran Services staff can explain those criteria.


Also, if you had any injury or illness during your military service and it is still bothering you now or you think it may have been caused by your military service you can file a disability claim with the VA. Typical claims are for hearing loss, tinnitus or the many diseases caused by exposure to Agent Orange, Burn Pits, Jet Fuels or Radiation exposure, the Veteran Services staff can discuss your situation and whether you should file a claim for compensation.

MUSIC at Market Square from 9:00 AM - Noon performed by Senior music students from Zach Fields Drum and Music.



A Message from Senator DiZoglio

Hello again,

Today in Massachusetts, there are more than 3,000 children in foster care with a goal of

adoption. With waitlists booming, countless children are waiting three or more years to be adopted.

Playing a truly invaluable role in this process are foster parents, providing a safe and stable environment for children who, due to a variety of reasons, cannot be with their biological parents. Children who have been uprooted from their homes need a place where they can feel secure. In all too many instances, they have suffered abuse and/or neglect and have no idea what a loving home feels like. Foster parents help them learn what it is like to eat, sleep, and play in a place that is safe.

In Massachusetts, the rights and responsivities for foster parents are spread out among an expansive set of laws, regulations and policies through The Department of Children and Families (DCF) that all too often leave foster parents feeling confused and unfairly treated.

That is why I am so grateful the Senate recently passed legislation I co-sponsored, An Act establishing a foster parents' bill of rights, designed to provide foster parents with the resources and supports they need to provide for children in their care.

Specifically, the legislation places into state law that foster parents have the right to pertinent training; information about the child to be placed in their home; access to a social workers and family resource workers: the opportunity to communicate with professionals who work with the child; and be updated on relevant changes in policies, procedures and law.

While many of these rights are already required elsewhere in Massachusetts law, by recognizing these as positive rights possessed by foster parents, rather than mere obligations for state agencies to uphold, the bill would ensure these standards are followed without exception in interactions between the state and foster parents. A copy of this bill of rights would be provided to foster parents to help support them as they support our children in need.



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
